

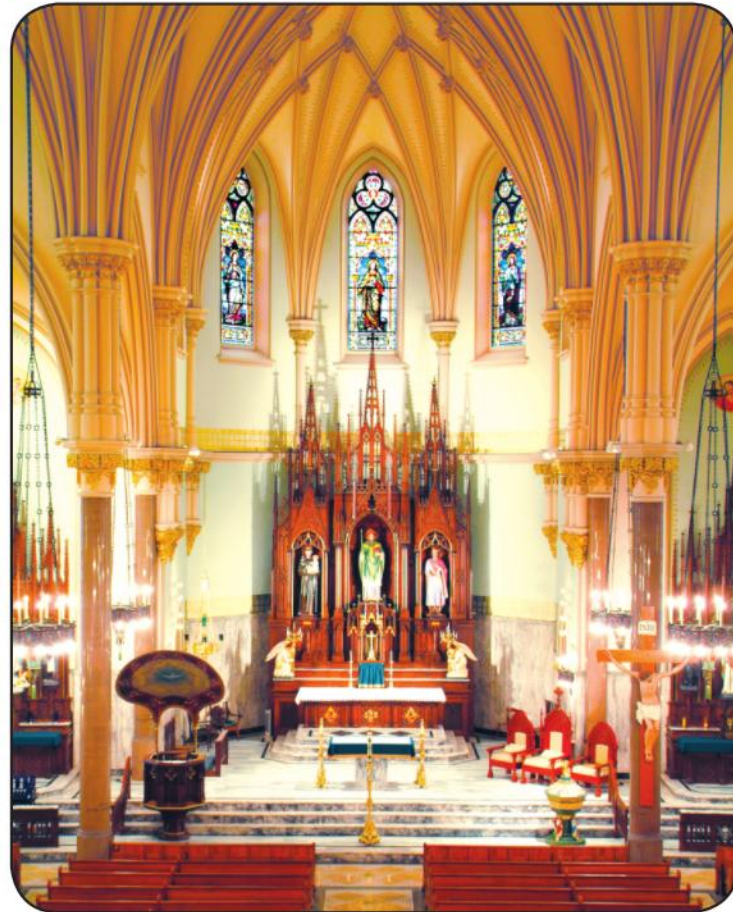

Dear People of God,

I'm often asked why I don't leap to the forefront to comment after some big disaster. The answer to that is many-faceted. First, the letters in the bulletin are provided weeks in advance to make sure we meet deadlines since the bulletin is printed in Columbus. Often disasters don't cooperate with the necessity of having the copy down there enough ahead of time to get the bulletin delivered before the Sunday Mass! Equally important is to focus on these tragedies after the uproar has settled to make sure the readership is less emotionally distracted and more intellectually adept. Unfortunately, we humans have a tendency to leap off the log and into the raging river before thinking about those rapids just around the corner. Time allows us to better grasp the immensity of the situation and draw conclusions based in solid fact rather than the conjecture and, equally unfortunately, mistaken reporting provided by a media which has to meet tighter deadlines than I do. Time also helps us overcome the cultural tendency to give even the worst disaster its "fifteen minutes of fame" and then move on to something else. A real disaster leaves behind effects which may endure for years and which demand more than a "Breaking News!" announcement on the television. As an example, I'm sure we all remember the Columbine event yet how many of us can recall how many students were killed and how many injured.

Can we readily bring to mind the name of the shooter at Sandy Hill, let alone the names of the families whose lives continue to be wracked by the losses experienced there? Do we remember how many lives were lost in the tsunami that came ashore in Japan? Can we identify the victims of the teen-aged shooter in Cleveland? or even El Paso? Have we followed up on the psychological studies of the people who perpetrate these terrible acts here in the U.S.? By holding off for a while, it might be possible to articulate ways and means of preventing such acts rather than just bemoan them in the moment. Here's a fact to chew on: Those who commit acts of random violence intending to kill as many as possible are almost always from broken homes, not just single-parent settings, but ones where domestic violence and disrespect for a spouse and/or children has been the norm. There is an answer to preventing these events: improve family life and grow respect for others. In the Church we refer to this as "love God with your whole mind, your whole heart, your whole soul and with all your strength, and love your neighbor as yourself." Acts of violence are the result of a culture which has failed to prepare young people, especially vulnerable boys, to love themselves appropriately, thus making it difficult or even impossible to love others.

### ***The Celebration of Sacraments***

**Infant Baptism:** The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults:** RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

**Penance:** The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony:** Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick:** When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

### Have you ever sat in church and looked around,

not fully understanding all the vessels, vestments, and articles surrounding you? Or worse, sat there wanting to know more but not knowing where to go or whom to ask?

As we begin to understand what the items are and why they are relevant, we can start to appreciate the beauty and depth of our Catholic Faith. The aim is to get to know the sacred items so that Mass can be a deeper and richer experience. These are taken from The Sacred that Surrounds Us by Andrea Zachman Ascension Press.



#### CHALICE

The chalice is a sacred cup that holds the wine that becomes the Precious Blood of Jesus. Remember the priest acts in *persona Christi* (in the person of Christ) when he consecrates the wine. Prior to Mass, the chalice is often placed on a credence table until it is needed. After the words of consecration, the chalice will not leave the sanctuary, even if Holy Communion is offered to the laity under both forms, until it has been properly cleaned.

Chalices today are made with either gold or silver, with the exception of pewter in churches that have financial hardships. With this exception is the condition that the chalice inside be gilt (gold in color). Today gold or silver is required so as not to rust, break easily, or have a porous nature. The chalice is consecrated by the bishop with holy chrism before liturgical use.

During the Mass, the priest places a few drops of water into the chalice with the wine signifying our humanity joining Jesus' divinity. The Gospels account for Jesus celebrating the Passover meal using a cup filled with wine at the Last Supper in Jerusalem. It was here, 2,000 years ago that Jesus first said the words of consecration. Our parish priests have the authority from Jesus, given to them at their ordination, to say those same words to consecrate the bread and wine. The celebrant's chalice is not used for administering the Precious Blood to the assembled congregation.
