

Dear People of God,

I mentioned last week that it's sometimes best to hold off for a while before officially commenting on extreme acts of violence. I thought today I'd upset a few more people by weighing in on the causes of such acts. There's a big debate over whether violent video games play a role. The people who make a huge profit from them say they're as innocent as the driven snow and actually divert young peoples' anger from other people to the images on the TV screen. I didn't entirely waste the bishop's money while studying for my doctorate so I spent a lot of time in the classroom and labs of the Faculty of Psychology at the University of Ottawa. One of the most important things I learned from that is the theory of attachment developed by a host of well-known and highly respected research psychologists. The theory suggests that in the first few minutes after birth (a traumatic experience not unlike being dropped from a second story window, by the way) an infant whom we've always considered a blank canvas is no such thing but is highly reactive to its environment and how it is accepted by the important people around it. One's deepest relational balance is established in those first five to eight minutes when the infant senses far better than we ever thought whether it is warmly, sort-of, or not welcomed (positive, ambivalent or negative attachment).

There has been an emotional and physical relationship already formed to the mother who carried the child, so the attachment to the mother following birth is extremely important for orderly, wholesome development of the child into adulthood. A positive attachment yields a happy-go-lucky child who can roll with the punches and face difficulty with a confident attitude. On the other hand, the ambivalent and negatively attached child needs a lot of external affirmation through childhood and adolescence (what a good family and friendships normally provide so most children grow up ok). Where the affirmation is lacking, or perceived to be non-existent (because the family may actually be pillars of virtue in every sense), the child grows up with what is sometimes referred to as "an attitude." These are the adolescents and young adults who are more often than not filled with unrequited anger, resentment, self-hatred and other serious issues which are the triggers just waiting to be tripped to rouse the person to acts of real violence. The solution to their dilemma is easy to see: wholesome family life in which respect, love and compassion are the norm, not the exception. That should help answer the question about video games that feature mass killings, big explosions and worse. In the end, thanks to all who have assisted with the ACA (Annual Catholic Appeal) this year: a very large part of your donation has gone to fund the Family Life Office.

# The Celebration of Sacraments

<u>Infant Baptism</u>: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults**: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

**Penance**: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony**: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

# Have you ever sat in Church and looked

**around**, not fully understanding all the vessels, vestments, and articles surrounding you? Or worse, sat there wanting to know more but not knowing where

to go or whom to ask?

As we begin to understand what the items are and why they are relevant, we can start to appreciate the beauty and depth of our Catholic Faith. The aim is to get to know the sacred items so that Mass can be a deeper and richer experience. These are taken from The Sacred that Surrounds Us by Andrea Zachman Ascension Press.

#### **PATEN**



The paten is a sacred plate that holds the bread that becomes the Body of Christ. The priest will take the bread, and after saying the words of consecration, put the Eucharist back onto the paten. As with the consecration of the wine, the priest acts *in persona Christi* (in the person of Christ) when he consecrates the bread. Prior to Mass the paten is placed on the chalice, under the chalice veil. It is then placed on the credence table until it is needed at Mass.

Patens today are usually the size of a small dish. At one time, patens were much larger and able to hold the entire amount of bread needed for consecration. Early patens of glass and wood as well as silver and gold would have been normal. Currently, patens are composed of the same material as the chalice. Like the chalice the paten is consecrated by the bishop with holy chrism before liturgical use.

Paten comes from the Latin word *patina*, which means "pan or dish". It is fitting that a plate is used in our Eucharistic celebration. Jesus is the bread of Life, born in the town of Bethlehem (Hebrew for the House of Bread), and placed in a manger (a food dish for animals.) Jesus is the Lamb of God placed upon this plate, and becomes for us our spiritual food.


