



Dear People of God,

I had begun a discussion of acts of violence and want to pick up on that today as well. If you pay close attention to the people who undertake acts of violence, you'll often discover that the people who take action are hoping to be part of the death toll. Often they know that they're walking into a situation from which they cannot hope to escape. We often hear or read that they do what they do to be the center of attention, and that may well be since these are people who have generally had (or think they've had) very little loving attention over the span of their lives. Teachers will reminisce that they had very low self-esteem, had few friends (because low self-esteem means it's really hard to make friends often they are actually afraid to try because the lack of esteem makes them feel like losers) and hung with the crowd of outsiders and outcasts. The shooter, for instance, in the El Paso incident admitted he went in wanting to be killed. He didn't like himself and could think of no better way to put an end to his own situation than inviting the police to come in and take him out in a body bag. This phenomenon has become so popular, it's now called "suicide by cop." It's happened right here in our own community. We can certainly analyze the perpetrator who doesn't succeed in getting himself killed and no doubt find all kinds of presenting psychological disorders. However, we need to keep in mind that while some disorders seem to be genetic in origin, others are not and have a source.

In either case, if we pay close attention to children and young adults, an appropriate early intervention can occur that teaches the child/adolescent/adult how to control and handle the disorder in a way that enhances social skills, builds healthy relationships and otherwise acts as a preventative for acts of violence. I would hazard to guess that the answer is once again a wholesome family life where the child is appreciated, loved, supported and guided by loving parents. Tragically, our culture has in many ways wreaked havoc on wholesome family life, but there are other ways to provide the appreciation, support and love. Boys and Girls Clubs, Big Brothers and Big Sisters, organizing a little league team recruited from the projects (with the goal of getting to the World Series in five years or less to make it interesting), or putting together a program for neighborhood kids to get out on the golf course are among viable options. (Thanks to personal experience, I don't recommend bowling. When I was the Youth Program Director in Swanton, I organized a bowling outing at Imperial Lanes. Around 2:00 a.m. - the hours from mid-night to six a.m. were "all you can bowl" for five bucks - one of the participants was almost asleep and rolled a ball down into the pin setter As committed Chrisso we were all thrown out.) tians there's plenty we can do to prevent acts of violence. Give it some thought.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

<u>Matrimony</u>: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.



As we begin to understand what the items are and why they are relevant, we can start to appreciate the beauty and depth of our Catholic Faith. The aim is to get to know the sacred items so that Mass can be a deeper and richer experience. These are taken from The Sacred that Surrounds Us by Andrea Zachman Ascension Press.

PALL

The pall that is used in the celebration of the Eucharist is a hard sacred covering that rests on top of the chalice to prevent dust and other contaminants from entering. This is especially crucial after the words of consecration, when these substances could mix in the Precious Blood. Prior to Mass, the pall is placed on top of the paten, under the chalice veil. It is then placed on the credence table until it is needed at Mass.


