



Dear People of God,

I was asked by a young visitor the other day about ringing bells at Mass. In her parish they don't ring them at all. We are once again looking at a practical matter which took on theological "meaning." The custom of ringing bells during the consecration dates back to the period when the Mass was a top secret bit of business in which the people took minimal part. This was one of the unintended consequences of the Council of Trent because the Mass is actually a family meal at which all are welcome and all should be participants, not mere observers. (Have you ever asked somebody over to watch you enjoy dinner and not take part?) The gathering of the Catholic bishops at Trent settled on a single expanded ritual for the celebration of Mass and devised the Roman Missal, of which we use an updated version today. The altar was placed against the back wall (something you won't see at St. Peter's, St. John Lateran or Mary Major in Rome or any church built before 1500 where the more traditional placement remained in effect) so the priest faced away from the congregation and what he was doing up there was, literally and figuratively, a mystery. To interrupt whatever might be going on out among the people when the consecration took place and call their attention to parts of the mass, the bells were rung (as a kid I recall the *Sanctus* went on for a longer period than it does now because our parish used scores written by the Masters, usually Mozart, and it stopped after the first set of hosannas). This occurred at determined moments.

The first time was the imposition of hands, a symbolic gesture which signaled the immense power of God being called down on the sacrificial gifts (listen to the priest and you'll hear him invoke the power of the Holy Spirit just as he does at baptism, reconciliation, anointing of the sick and as the bishop does at orders and confirmation). A second ringing occurred when the priest elevated the host. Because he did it where no one could see and the entire purpose was for the public veneration of the Body of Christ by the congregation, the congregation needed to be advised to do some venerating. A third ring let the people know that the Blood of Christ had been consecrated and the people were again to offer public veneration. A fourth ring when the celebrant knelt signaled that the people could get back to whatever they were doing before being interrupted (usually a rosary). When the bishops gathered for the Second Vatican Council, asking for full, active participation of the people, they recognized that a priest facing away from the people made no sense whatever so they mandated that churches be returned to the more ancient model with the priest behind the altar facing the people so they could follow along and visually respond to the key moments of the consecration. Unless somebody was chattering with a neighbor at the back of the church or out on the front steps grabbing a quick smoke, ringing bells was no longer necessary and many parishes decided to retire them. Other parishes retained the custom following the preferences of the pastor rather than any hard and fast rule which means that any time a pastor leaves and a new one arrives, the custom may or may not be followed.

### **The Celebration of Sacraments**

**Infant Baptism:** The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults:** RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

**Penance:** The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony:** Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick:** When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

### Have you ever sat in church and looked

As we begin to understand what the items are and why they are relevant, we can start to appreciate the beauty and depth of our Catholic Faith. The aim is to get to know the sacred items so that Mass can be a deeper and richer experience. These are taken from The Sacred that Surrounds Us by Andrea Zachman Ascension Press.

#### STAINED GLASS WINDOWS

Stained glass windows (colored glass) are one way the Church presents for our prayerful consideration holy people, different parts of our Catholic Faith, and symbols that have great meaning to us.

Starting out small around the twelfth century, stained glass windows developed into massive examples of beauty. They have served multiple functions within the church. Those that could not read learned by looking at the pictures and events portrayed in stained glass. The light also serves the natural function of illumination our church during the daytime. The beauty we see of the depicted saints and stories of God and his Church help us to deepen our knowledge and devotion to the divine.

The light that comes through illuminates what is happening and reminds us of God light in each window's scene. God gives us physical light so that we can see things and spiritual light so that we can see with the eyes of faith. During sunrise Mass, you can see the stained glass windows come alive as the light begins to shine through them.
