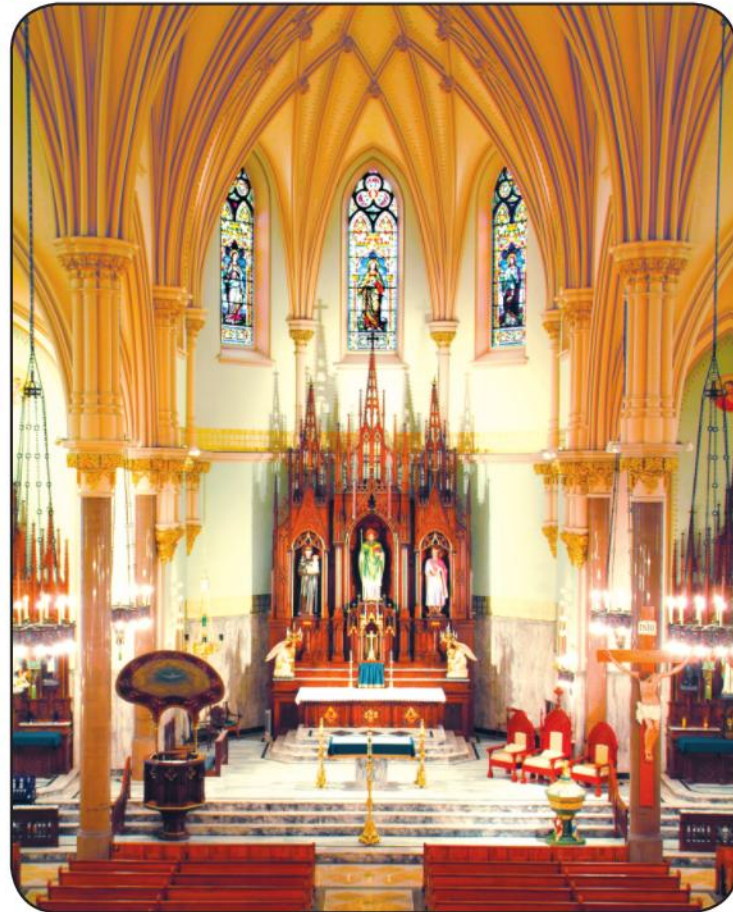

Dear People of God,

Someone asked me the other day why we continue to use vestments if they were all borrowed from Roman daily wear and serve no practical purpose. Well, I'm not sure they serve no practical purpose, especially the polyester double knit which can be comfortably warm on a cold winter's morning! The answer is relatively complicated and has to do with the ritualization of human behaviors, the nature of the Mass and its historical development and custom.

Ritualization means repeating some action to get the same expected or desired results. Think of breakfast and how often you follow the same routine (a word springing from the same root as ritual). Vestments are ritualized because they visually assist us in getting to those same results we expect at Mass. It's a familiar behavior in other areas – watch the Packers and see how many fans are wearing cheese hats which is a form of vestment worn by those expecting a Packers victory! Our chasubles, copes, albs and stoles help all of us focus on the sacred which we have come to church to discover in a particular way at the table of the Lord.

The Nature of the Mass means what it is and why. The mass quite literally breaks the bonds of time and space and unites us with everyone who has ever been at Mass and who will ever be at Mass in the distant future. We, and everyone else, are at the Last Supper with Jesus.

Marking out that miraculous O of all humanity in one Last Supper demands we dress accordingly and that means, at least for the celebrant and those in the Sanctuary, wearing clothing which stands out as being very different from everyday wear. This used to percolate into the community which would never have come to Mass not wearing "Sunday Best."

Custom means the "tradition," the habituated way we do things. Habits are ways we humans have developed to save time and energy. Having a wardrobe we can return to for various events, celebrations, places and whatever helps us get ready for what we plan to do at those events, celebrations, places and whatever. It's not the same as when someone responds, "Because we've always done it that way." It's what has been devised to make us feel comfortable in a particular setting. We wouldn't wear fancy dress clothes to the beach because we'd feel uncomfortable with everyone staring at us. Nor would we wear swim suits to Mancy's, Packos or any other fine dining room. By the same token, *Sunday Best* for the presider means a very specific wardrobe that makes one and all feel comfortable assisting at a sacred event.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

SACRED ARTWORK, ICONS AND STATUES

Sacred artwork and icons are a reflection of God's holiness. Sacred artwork might be placed around the church and on the walls and can be made out of a variety of materials, including metal, wood, and framed pictures. Icons are written prayers and particular form of sacred art using natural pigments. Sacred artwork and icons help teach us our Catholic Faith and tell us a story through images.
