

Dear People of God,

A Happy New Year to one and all! You know, new year's day has fluctuated from civilization to civilization, historical era to historical era. A year is, and has been since people began to learn how to make note of passing seasons, 365 days from beginning to end, but how do you determine the beginning or the end? For the Church the beginning is the prophetic announcement that a Messiah is to come which was celebrated for us a few weeks ago on the first Sunday of Advent. For the Romans and many other ancient peoples, the spring equinox heralded the new year which was formally celebrated April 1. Meso-America celebrated new year's day around solstice time in winter when the temple priests could tell visibly that the day was actually getting longer. For many in the east, the new year begins in mid-winter, usually some time in February. For each of us, a new year begins on our birthday. In most cultures a new year is celebrated with festivity and joy, filled with the hope that the future will be bright and blessed. In our own culture we make note of this by making those famous but rarely kept resolutions, things we can do which will assure that the year ahead is better than the year behind. For us Catholics those resolutions might be something similar to the "firm purpose of amendment" we pray for in reconciliation.

Perhaps we could use the first week or two of the new year to consider why the last one didn't go as we thought it should and discover some weakness in our behavior that could easily be corrected. I'm thinking of some of the small stuff, not those huge, intimidating behaviors that are so deeply set in place that it would take several crow bars to work them loose. By changing a few small things, we can begin to chip away at the bigger issues; unfortunately, attacking the big issues in life by making a resolution to change them often falls to the wayside far too quickly. To make life better, try one of these on for size. Each morning as you come fully awake, say a quick Thank You to God for the opportunity to live this day. At the end of the day, take a second or two to consider one positive thing you did to make life better for somebody other than yourself. You might try printing up a short, four or five word prayer and taping it to the mirror where you prepare for the day, something like "Today is yours, Jesus" and discover that things do go better because, without a lot of effort, you've made a real sacrifice and God will step in to make it worth your while. A new year offers new opportunity to accomplish much; I pray that as you enter into this new year, you do discover many blessings from our loving God.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.



Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency

during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses, Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion, When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan, parish, or school events in that geographic region are also cancelled.
