

Dear People of God,

Thanks to all who have been praying for my eye-health. Many have asked what happened so let me share the saga up to this writing (Jan 11).

I went to Lima on Monday, December 16, and around noon felt an ache begin behind my right eye (the one without macular degeneration) so I decided to forgo my favorite Lima eateries and set out directly to Toledo. The ache grew worse and as I arrived at the 475 split, I noticed a black snow falling. I thought it was ash from a fire, but then a brown lace curtain began to fall over my right eye. By the time I arrived at the rectory, the lacy curtain had become a curtain obscuring vision.

Sherri was quick to call my eye doctor and the office said to report first thing Tuesday morning. They sent me right over to Flower Hospital where I was prepped for surgery.

I imagine the surgical tools were all pretty small. The infection that had developed was vacuumed out, two powerful antibiotics were injected, and an air bubble was added to prevent the antibiotics leaking from the injection points. Since the 17th, it's been a slow recovery of vision- unfortunately the cataract in the right eye was adversely affected and grew increasingly clouded which has made seeing anything in the right eye like opening your eyes under water in Lake Erie without a diving mask. However, thanks to the quick intervention by the eye surgeon and your kind prayers, things should be fairly normal once the cataract is removed.

One of the beneficial side effects of all this has been the improvement in the left eye as it has begun to make greater use of peripheral vision to make out text. I can at least make out the bold headlines in the newspaper so may soon be able to use the "super-sized" Roman Missal to get back on the altar and preside at mass.

The Sisters of Notre Dame (I'm an Associate member and often pray for the Sisters and other Associates; Deacon Tom is also an Associate) have offered to drive me to the Shrine of Solanus Casey in Detroit for prayers of thanksgiving and healing. Blessed Solanus was well-known for establishing one of the first major outreach programs in the Detroit area so it's a great place for me (and any of us) to turn to for his intercession. He needs another substantial miracle to be canonized a Saint so who knows?

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.


#### The HSP Soup Kitchen
