

PRESENTAT

Dear People of God,

The Winter Wednesday series this year is focused on Apologetics - the ways and means of defending our faith. I suspect the evening sessions or the many resources you can access on Formed will offer a reasoned theological method, but I want to focus on the ordinariness of what many non-Catholics attack. For example, we Catholics are often accused of worshiping the saints. Non-Catholics scoff at our veneration of relics, yet both saints and relics are part of the every day experiences of humanity everywhere.

For example, I have what I consider a memorable collection (hence on display for others to "venerate"- a term which means "pay awed attention") of artifacts associated with highly respected people: of course, it's autographed baseballs of famous, highly skilled players from Cleveland and Detroit (I need a Miguel Cabrerra, but like relics of the more famous religious figures, an autographed baseball is far beyond my means.) I consider myself to be particularly favored to possess a 1948 American League Championship pennant (Cleveland Indians, by the way) and have in this secular relic collection a rookie-year autographed photo of Derek Jeter and a collage from 2011 when Jeter hit his 3000th time at bat - collectors would value even a bit of his batting glove (what we would consider an important sacred relic had Jeter been canonized.

Collecting and displaying relics is quite ordinary; it could be grandma's wedding dress, a fine timepiece carried by great grandpa, a bit of fine Irish soil gathered from the family home place while visiting the Emerald Isle, a few petals from the roses which graced the casket at dad's funeral, an aged baptismal gown passed from generation to generation, or any of the important mementoes in your own home that you've kept to honor someone important in your life. Sacred relics remind us that in our Christian family, there are the same kind of important people we choose to honor.

Speaking of important people we remember, I made it to the Shrine of Blessed Solanus Casey the last Saturday in January, thanks to Sisters Francis Marie and Mary Vivette, SND, who drove me up there (that's me at the tomb of the Blessed). I had the opportunity to pray with the Capuchin Provincial, Father Michael Sullivan, that God's will be done. I

was really taken aback by the Shrine and its environs. It was a wonderful experience and I'm sure our prayers garnered someone a miracle through Blessed Solanus.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.





God gives us these guides so that we may have superhuman help on our way to heaven. Our guardian angels want to help us cooperate with the will of God and they want to keep us from sinning. They want to help us to help others—and they want to keep us from mucking up the lives of others. Along the way, of course, they may help us to walk safely across an unsteady bridge, but only if that will accomplish God's will for us and for the world. They want the best for us, which does not always coincide with the things we desire most. The difficult fact is that what's best for us does not necessarily correspond with our comfort, health, or safety. Sometimes suffering is what's best for us, if only because it keeps us from sinning or tempting others to sin. The angels follow after God's pattern of governance: they sometimes give us what we want so that we'll learn to ask for what we need.

Always remember: we are God's children now. No one spends as much on child care as God does. Why does he lavish so much on us, creating powerful pure spirits to watch over us? He loves us.

We were created to be not a random collection of carbon, hydrogen, and oxygen molecules, but as temples of the Holy Spirit. Our angels are charged with the task of protecting the sanctuary and keeping it pure for the presence of God.

We would do well often to pray the rhyme that's taught to little children: Angel of God, my guardian dear, To whom God's love commits me here: Ever this day be at my side To light and guard, to rule and guide. Amen
