Dear People of God,

With Pope Francis we're giving our attention to The Word and the sacred texts which are the front of revelation of God's great love for his people. As I mentioned earlier, I'll be commenting on some issues and themes which characterize the development of what know today as Let's begin at the beginning - The Book of Genesis. In general, this book is a collection of oral stories (they date to a period so early in Hebrew history that there was no writing). These were generally told by the wise old grandfathers in response to a question posed by the eager-to-learn youngsters. All of them are meant to solidify the listeners' connections to the family, an important and even vital aspect to tribal existence. Of course, most of the guestions and most of the answers are universal - every tribe asked them and every wise old elder did his best to answer them in a way that was appropriate to his tribe.

The first question in most ancient cultures, including the Hebrew world, is "How did all this come to be?" In most of the cultures from Egypt to Sumeria, the answers were found to be similar and were based on what grandpa could see: the forces in nature and human reproduction.

However, for the Hebrews there was something far grander than wind, rain, sun, moon, and mom and dad! Inspired by the Holy Spirit, the Hebrews attributed the creature essence to a mighty God who, from nothing, created all that is. Curiously, no other ancient cult ever got as far as creation "ex nihilo" (from nothing). For the Hebrews, this created a God who was a patriarchal God who used the original creation as "staff" to fashion, make and manufacture everything else we can see around us with two exceptions: the beasts of the deep sea and From nothing, God created humanity. course, we ought to be asking why we're so different (which is the ultimate question behind the rest of the questions in Genesis). Why is humanity not simply a handful of mud scooped out of some primordial swamp? For the Hebrews the answer was clear enough: God would not use mud to implant his very image and likeness in the created order. You and I are God's loving presence in the world.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

<u>Matrimony</u>: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

According to the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, "only low-gluten (partially gluten-free) hosts are valid matter, provided they contain a sufficient amount of gluten to obtain the confection of bread without the addition of foreign materials and without the use of procedures that would later the nature of bread.

Jesus Gives Us the Beatitudes

Have you ever looked at the beatitudes as Be Attitudes? What kind of attitude should we have when life Jesus spells out this special message for each of us in the opening of his Sermon on the Mount.

After a night of prayer, Jesus selected his twelve disciples. He taught them how to live in the kingdom of heaven right here on earth. We can learn about his teachings in the Sermon on the Mount. This sermon begins by telling us how to be happy and the rewards of being happy.

The beatitudes are specific attitudes "to be."

Blessed are the poor in spirit: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

The first beatitude tells us we should be happy even if we feel poor or at the end of our rope, because our reward is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are they that mourn: for they shall be comforted.

The second beatitude says we should be happy when we feel we've lost someone or something special because God is always at hand to comfort us-whether the problem is big or small.

Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.

In the third beatitude, we are happy with ourselves, not trying to be better than we are, not bragging about what we've accomplished or what we own, because God has made sure we inherit everything that can't be bought. When we are satisfied with being made in God's image and likeness, we inherit his goodness.

Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied.

The fourth beatitude asks us to be happy when we are willing to be hungry and thirsty for goodness. We should be careful not to want what isn't good for us. We can't be junk food Christians and expect to be satisfied. God fills us with the best feast there is.


