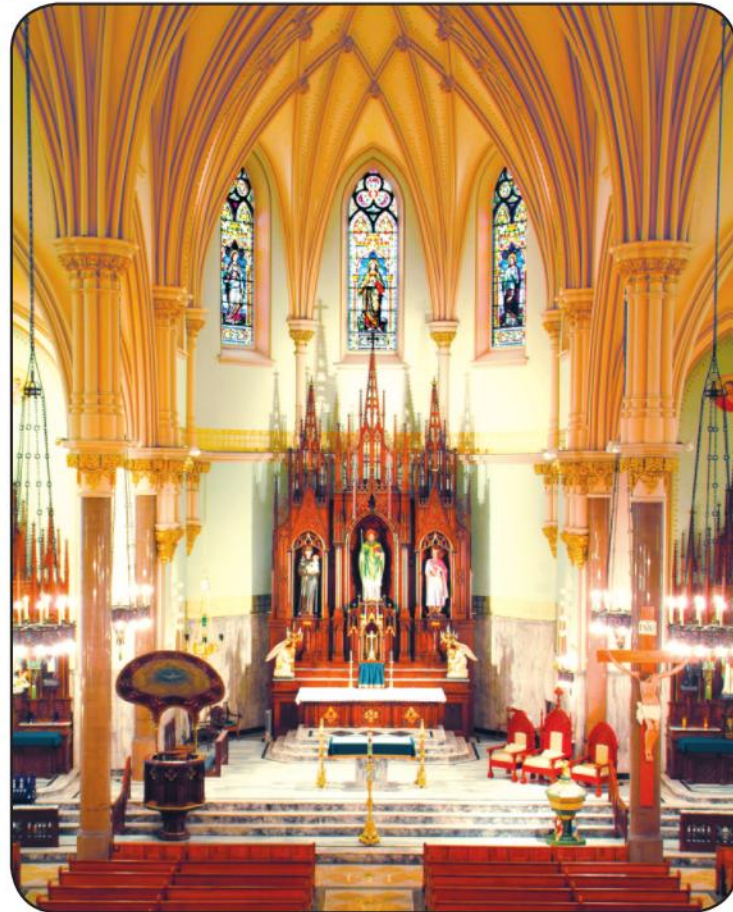

Dear People of God,

This Wednesday begins our only surviving "Penitential Season" - the Forty Days of Lent. In the good old days, some of us older and more-seasoned Catholics remember that there were several similar periods when the faithful were urged to repent of their sins and do penance. Many non-Catholics never understood all of "that penance stuff" but, as so much else in our Catholic tradition, penance is just another common, ordinary activity of humanity in general but which takes on a uniquely Catholic spirituality.

Penance is nothing more than doing some acts of good to make up for some acts not-so-good done either accidentally or deliberately. A good example of this (since it's February) is the famous story of Abe Lincoln as a young teen working in a general store in southern Indiana, a store which was still there even a few years ago. A customer was accidentally overcharged and Abe, rather than wait for the customer to return, walked several miles to give him his change: an act of good to make up for an accidental not-so-good.

The famous Lenten Practices are all common human activities which have the spiritual potential to open our minds, hearts and souls to God and the love he has for us. You can learn a lot more about Lenten Practices by accessing [Formed](#); there are diverse resources about Lent and the Lenten readings for the cycle - Matthew as well as all the others. Let's take a quick look at two well-known practices.

**Prayer:** Prayer is a spiritual conversation; we talk to God and ideally we listen. Conversation is the most ordinary human activity of all. This letter is a form of conversation because it's generating a response in every reader's mind, and often that response is shared with me via email, a note, or after mass when a question continues the conversation!

**Alms:** Derived from Latin and Greek for *compassion, pity, mercy* or *charity*, alms refers to acts of charity. They include common human behaviors. Consider the casseroles taken to the home of a family experiencing sickness or death. Think about giving blood to save a life or assembling box lunches to send to Oregon to feed the victims of recent flooding. Schools, friends, families and individuals award scholarships to those in need. All these show ordinary people doing ordinary alms-giving.

The difference is that what we do as Catholics is to recognize the sacred dimension of what God wants us to do for God and for others in fulfillment of the Great Command: Love God with all your strength and love your neighbor as you love yourself. Enjoy these forty days of Lent doing many of the same things you do every day but doing them for the love of our loving God.

### ***The Celebration of Sacraments***

**Infant Baptism:** The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults:** RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

**Penance:** The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony:** Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick:** When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

## Happenings at the Parish!

### Fast and Abstinence

The regulations on Lenten fast and abstinence are :

**FASTING:** On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, those who are 18 but not yet 60 are allowed only one full meal. Two smaller meals are allowed as needed, but eating solid foods between meals are not permitted.

#### ABSTINENCE FROM MEAT:

Those who are 14 years of age or older are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent.

On Ash Wednesday, as I receive my ashes I am invited to respond to the call to forgive those who have wronged me, ask forgiveness of those whom I have wronged and to ask forgiveness of God.

#### Three stages of forgiveness:

Instead of identifying the person totally with whatever they did to hurt me, I begin to see them as a person like me—imperfect, but still someone God loves.

I give up my "right" to get even. Vengeful thoughts don't make the other person suffer. They hurt me. So I just plain rinse my mind of those kinds of thoughts.

I stand next to the Lord and together with him look at the other person. For sure Jesus wants good things to happen to them. So, with the Lord's help (and some struggle), I begin to look at the other person the way the Lord does.

Take 10 seconds to think of some one you find hard to forgive. Now you understand why these three stages can't be accomplished in one sitting..or one day.

But you might be able to do it by Easter.

### Jesus Gives Us the Beatitudes

#### Beatitudes continued –

*Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy.*

The fifth beatitude helps us to stop and think about how we want to be treated and how to treat others. It's another way of saying the Golden Rule. We need to be caring if we ever hope to be cared for. We should always be kind and then Jesus promises we will find kindness.

*Blessed are the pure of heart, for they shall see God.*

The sixth beatitude guarantees we'll be happy when we have a pure heart. We need to have pure motives, no hidden plan. When we are squeaky clean inside, we get to see God work in our lives.

*Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called children of God.*

The seventh beatitude asks us to practice making peace. The word "peacemaker" is the Greek means to practice the presence of God. If we are practicing the presence of God, then we are most assuredly God's children. We wouldn't want to be anything less.

*Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.*

The eighth beatitude reminds us to stay happy when people say bad things about you because we put God first. Our reward for loving God and dealing with name-calling from those who don't understand God is having the kingdom of heaven right within us.
