

Dear People of God,

Last week I began Lent by writing about the parish; now I want to expand on that theme to discuss how a parish is run. Many people believe that the various Councils and Commissions "run" the parish and make the decisions. They do not. At the parish level, the Pastor, as the canonical agent of the parish, makes the decisions. The Councils and Commissions are consultative only; they advise, but their consent, while always a good idea, is not necessary.

This structure often causes some rumbling and resentment, but there's method to the madness here: there's a deliberate distance between those who serve on the various consulting bodies and the lawyers who may want to sue the parish for negligence, fraud, or something else. The pastor can be sued; the consultants cannot because they haven't made the resulting negligent or fraudulent decisions.

At the parish level there are some controls over the pastor in 2 key areas: mostly in the area of liturgy where the bishop retains the real power and also in the area of money, or at least spending it. In general, the pastor has to consult with his Finance Council if he wants to spend over \$5,000. If he wants to spend \$20,000, say for roof repair, he needs their support and the approval of the related diocesan financial office and/or the bishop. If the pastor wants to sell parish property of any value, he needs the support of the Finance Council and permission from the bishop and in some cases, The Holy See.

Of course, there are a lot of things that happen in a parish that may look like somebody is making decisions— buying the candles, ordering the hosts and wine, buying cleaning supplies, running Outreach and lots more. All of these ultimately land on the desk of the pastor who serves as the chief steward of the parish. He is under the mandate of the bishop to work diligently for the welfare of existing members and to urge those members to contribute their time, talent, and treasure to keep the place going and growing.

Consulting bodies (Pastoral Council, Finance Council, Outreach, Evangelization, Liturgy) exist to assist the pastor in leading the parish so it will grow to meet the expanding needs of the people and the communities it serves. Creative and imaginative ideas proposed by the consulting bodies are always welcomed by the responsive pastor who then enables the laity to take up the various ministries that are the lifeblood of an active, alive parish.

Where the involvement of parishioners is encouraged and developed, the future of a parish is defined and assured. Where this involvement is discouraged or prevented by the well-meaning "ownership" of a minister or program, that minister or program will not long survive. The task of the pastor is to enable the large numbers of men and women to do what their energy and talents allow for the building up of the Kingdom in the here and now.

#### The Celebration of Sacraments

<u>Infant Baptism</u>: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults**: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

**Penance**: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony**: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
