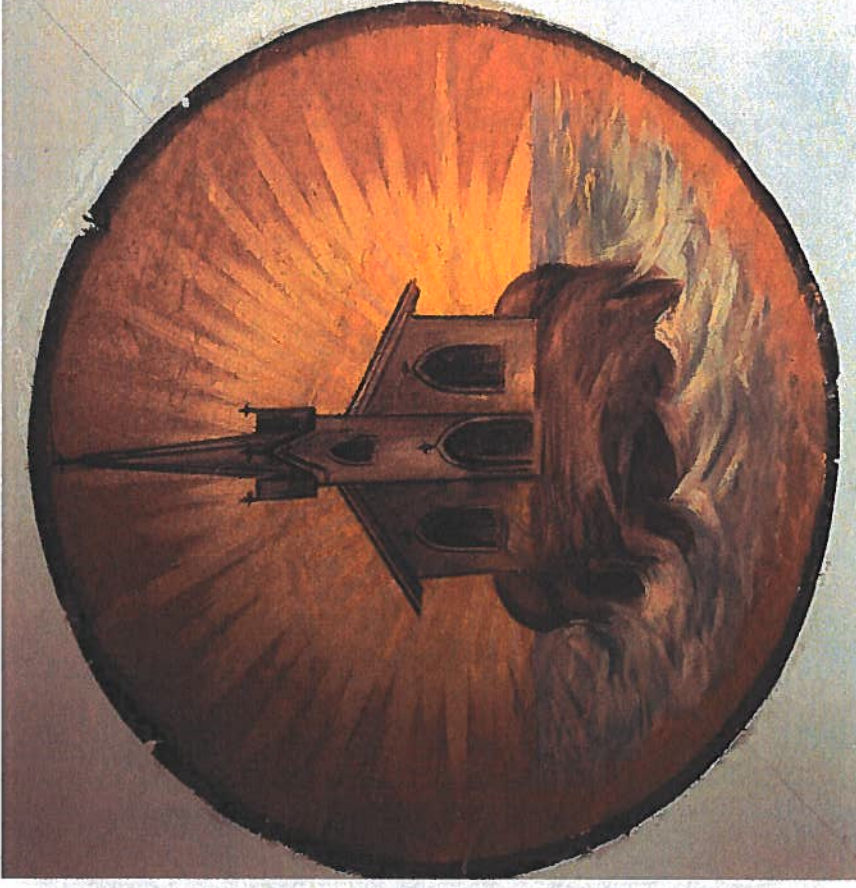


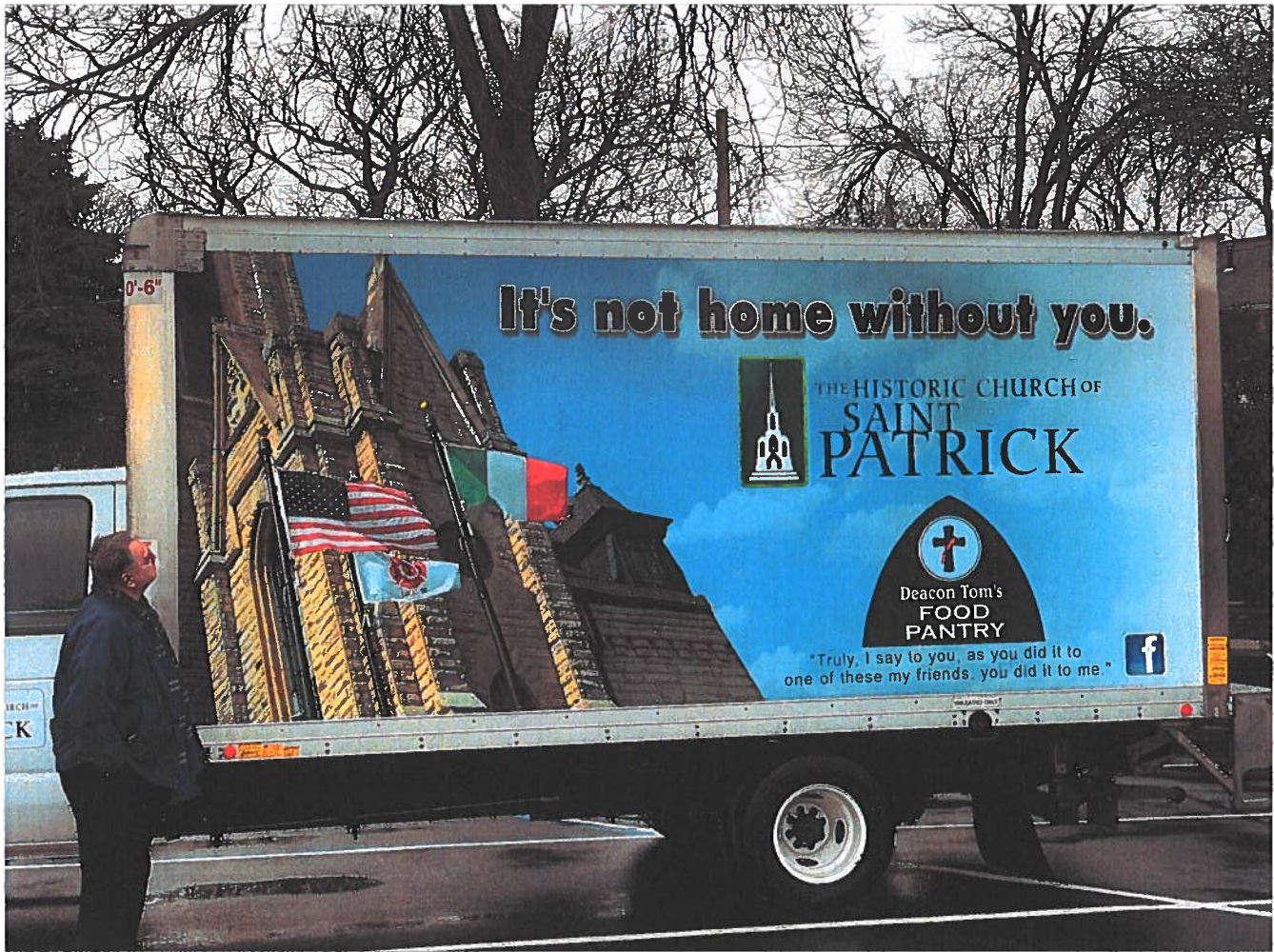
## Thank You

Above are a before and not-quite after (the conservation is ongoing at this point) photo of the 1863 roundel which once graced the first church here at St. Patrick. Conservation has removed a century and a half of grime, soot, candle wax and dirt and begun the removal of folding breaks in the pigment. When completed, the roundel, and its partner from that same era, will become a treasured glimpse into the founding days of the Historic Church of St. Patrick. Continued support of the Preservation Society will enable other projects over the days and years to come.
