### PARISH STAFF FOR HSP

Dear People of God,

A few weeks ago, I had started some letters intending to join with our Holy Father Francis in celebrating The Word. I began by observing that the Book of Genesis features stories collected from the oral period, that time when there was no written language. Because so many were attributed to a grandfather as narrator, this raised questions: What's with grandad telling all the stories? Where was grandma? Out doing the laundry?

Many people are offended that the Old Testament seems to be a "man's world" with little place for women. This interpretation is in large part due to the failure of the modern world to bring to bear a better understanding of the history and culture of the people of the ancient world. In fact, women played an important and vital role in most ancient cultures. Grandma was far too important to spend time recounting stories for the younger generation because it was largely her responsibility to keep the tribe or clan profitable. The senior female was the accountant, the doctor, the teacher, and the manager of the work force who actually did the laundry.

Yes, the ladies were sheltered and protected by warrior males but this reflected their necessary role as mothers generating the next round of workers, bakers, shepherds and all the rest necessary for the very survival of the family and its fortunes. There usually was a woman behind any successful throne! Of course, there aren't a lot of stories about this in the Bible, but if you want to see one, read the story of Abram and Sara in Egypt. (You can find it, listen to it, or watch a video on Formed). A drought had sent Abram and Sara to spend some time visiting Pharaoh who takes an interest in Sara until he discovers the lovely young woman is Abram's wife. Look at the huge bribe he pays Abram to say "I'm sorry" and you'll understand the importance of women in Old Testament times!

Pope Pius XII invited Catholic scholars to begin studying the Bible in terms of the history, demographics, language, and culture of the period when the oral stories were told and then recorded. Catholic scholarship has much to offer to help all of us to better understand the texts, how they came about, and how God uses them to teach us of his great love. ## The Celebration of Sacraments

**Infant Baptism**: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>**: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

**Penance**: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony**: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick**: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
