That is as short-sighted as is our belief that once we get past Covid-19, we're all going to be fine. Our faith in the resurrection is founded on the resurrection of Jesus who came back to join his disciples, not to dash off and leave them to wait for some future final judgment. He informs us that life here and now is precious, wonderful, and a miracle worth fighting for in every sense. The dignity of human life urges us to do everything in our power, including prayer, to protect life and empower men and women, young and old, to live a full and productive life. Our faith illuminates the wonder of every life and should have all of us asking whether one or more of the sixty million Americans lost to abortion was given the gifts and talents to find the cure for all viral diseases, let alone Covid-19. As we yearn today for the fullness of life for those affected by this new virus, let's not forget to yearn for the lives of those threatened by humanity's disregard for life and willingness to cut it short almost before it begins.

Easter is a time to celebrate life, life in the Kingdom yet to come but life right now as well. As we continue to practice social distancing, perhaps we might consider the immense sadness of Jesus who had to practice his own version of social distancing in the tomb, but as he only did it for a brief time, so to, the winter will pass. May the risen Christ touch you with his manifold blessings and should you have the Corona-virus, may he restore you to the fullness of health. May we all soon be able to gather as one to thank God for the gift of life.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
