Dear People of God,

As we continue to follow the summons of our spiritual Father Pope Francis to pay special attention to The Word, I've been looking at some of the key issues raised in just one book of the Old Testament: Genesis.

Today I would like to focus on an interesting topic that repeatedly occurs in the Book: Marriage. In fact, if you pay attention to the thematic notions layered into the stories collected in Genesis, you'll discover over 100 references to what marriage should be and what it shouldn't be. At the very beginning of the Book, as a central revelation of both of the creation texts, God lays out marriage as one man and one woman cooperating in the (a) stewardship of all creation and (b) the perpetuation of what God instituted in the initial creation Adam and Eve. The very words of Adam in Creation Two (the much older version) tell us a lot about marriage: "This at last is flesh of my flesh and bone of my bone." No wonder then that God says as a genuine marriage bond "What God has joined, no-one (not the partner, not the neighbor, not the courts, not the priest) may separate.

From the words of Adam (it's actually a song, the second one we find in Genesis; the first is God singing the creation of humankind in Creation One), we discover that a genuine marriage is the completion of the self in the person of the beloved: what is missing in the self is filled up with the spouse and the two do, in fact, become one, the one both were intended to be from the moment God said "Let there be light." All the remaining references, in one way or another, highlight the mistakes people make in seeking and finding the one person who God put out there to be the perfect spouse. You may want to search <u>Formed</u> to look into the role of marriage in Genesis. You may also want to look at my comment on "Marriage in Genesis" which should be available in the St. Patrick's library. It's pretty technical but includes a chart on the more important references to marriage in the Appendices so you can look them up and enjoy a good read.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Need-based Scholarships Awarded for

Students to Attend a Private School

The Northwest Ohio Scholarship Fund has announced that they have awarded a total of 620 scholarships including 108 new scholarships for the 2019-2020 school year. The eligibility scale for these scholarships is based on the National School Lunch Program and all of the families receiving the scholarship are at the 270% poverty level or below.

The Northwest Ohio Scholarship Fund (NOSF) provides privately funded scholarships to students from low-income families in grades K-8 to attend a private school or for homeschool expenses.

Once awarded, families can renew their children's scholarship each year if they meet the income eligibility requirements and can also add siblings. LIVESTREAM MASS UPDATE

The hope was for Mass livestreaming to alternate weeks between HSP and Immaculate Conception. Unfortunately, livestreaming has not been successful at IC, and now we are focusing on livestreaming Mass exclusively from HSP.

We have discovered in our livestreaming journey that the most popular time to stream Mass is at 10 a.m. on Sunday. With so many Catholics and Protestants online streaming and viewing, it means the video quality for viewers isn't very good and it is also difficult to successfully livestream from the church.

To solve this issue, we now livestream Sunday Mass at 9 a.m. so that the recorded video is available at 10 a.m. Playing a previously recorded video at 10 a.m. does not have glitches for viewers. Wednesday evening does not have a problem with internet traffic, so Mass will now be at our usual time of 5:30. Once livestreaming of Mass is complete, the videos remain on our Facebook page for viewing at any time.

Diocesan Website Updated

The Diocese of Toledo has added seven new names to the Clergy Status Report the Diocesan website page on (www.toledodiocese.org), now to include those clerics against whom an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor, now substantiated, was first reported after the cleric's death. Because these clerics were already deceased and no longer posed a threat, no canonical process was required or undertaken, and their names had not been included on the website.

When the Clergy Status Report, first published in 2004, was updated in 2019, it indicated that "the documentation of these cases will now be presented to the Board, Review that will make a recommendation, based on the available evidence, as to whether these clerics' names should be added to the Clergy Status Report." That process has now been completed. As a result, please consult the new section on the Clergy Status Report; Were "Clergy Who Deceased Prior to an Allegation."

Any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor by a priest, deacon, staff member or volunteer affiliated with the Diocese of Toledo should first be reported to local law enforcement where the abuse is alleged to have occurred. Please also report any such allegation to the Diocesan Victim Assistance Coordinator at 419-214 -4880.
