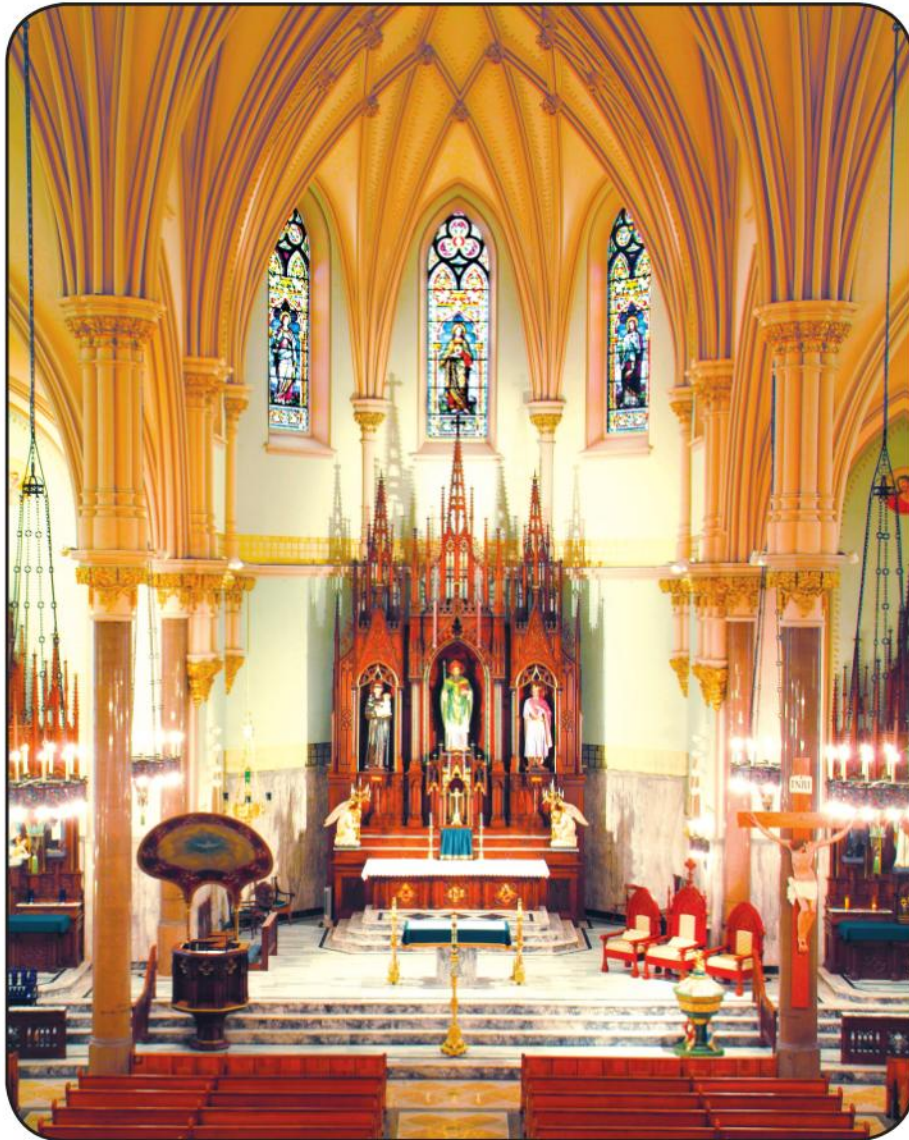

Dear People of God,

As we continue our celebrations/ explanations of The Word, I'd like to continue to point out some of the lesser known facts in the Book of Genesis. As I observed earlier, the stories of the people who would eventually compose the written Word first told the stories to give "the younger generation" some practical advice while introducing them to the social construct of a tribal economy.

One of the major thematic issues of the Book of Genesis is to explain how and when the twelve tribes coalesced from the one tribe founded by Abram as he sought to do God's will. Note that the typical dynamic of growth is represented throughout Genesis: (a) Cain's descendants form a new tribe after the death of Abel; (b) Ishmael, Abram's son by Hager, founds a "great nation" after being excluded by Sara; (c) Lot, Abram's nephew, founds the first city-based tribal unit, thus starting a theme of city vs. country which runs all through the Old Testament; (d) Esau establishes a tribe distinct from that of his fraternal twin Jacob; (e) returning from Egypt, Jacob's children establish the well-known twelve tribes; there are actually thirteen because Joseph has no tribe of his own but his two sons Manasseh and Ephraim each get a tribal designation.

Tribes exist to survive so Genesis is replete with advice on how to survive: the key principle was being faithful to the God who provided protection for the tribe. The stories are also written in a way that puts the listener in the action: the story is not just a pleasant recollection but an immersion in the events that created and sustained the tribe.

We might think that all this tribal stuff is just that- "stuff." However, if you pay attention to the human condition in any age, including ours, you'll see a lot of tribal dynamics on display. The Hebrews had a distinct mark of membership: circumcision. Browns fans have distinctive orange and brown markings to indicate belonging and when their team wins, "we" win, not "them." Political parties make use of tribal dynamics which is why Democrats and Republicans (who identify themselves with donkeys and elephants) tend to disagree so vociferously. There are distinct regional differences and these often reflect tribal dynamics. Reading Genesis (or listening to a good audio commentary in Formed) might inspire insight into our own "tribes" and also help us to better understand the decisions we make on a daily basis, especially as they relate to our own tribal affiliations.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

With the changes required by the Diocese of Toledo, the role of Liturgical Ministers will be different at our Masses for a while. Eucharistic Ministers will **not** be utilized as Communion will only be the Body of Christ and distributed by the priest and deacon. We will not have a choir, there will be no acolytes and no hospitality after Mass.

There are still ways to answer God's call to ministry, though. Please consider trying a new role at Mass. Once we have the names of the people willing to participate, a new schedule will be created and mailed.

Liturgical Ministers during COVID-19

Lector – We still need proclaimers of the Word at both the 8 a.m. Mass and 10 a.m. Mass on Sunday mornings. We will happily train anyone interested in serving as lectors who have not read at Mass before.

What to know:

Lectors must be age 65 or younger to be on the altar, or willing to sign a waiver

Lectors may read both readings and the stanzas of the psalm

If there are two lectors for Mass, there will be six feet of separation between the seats for proper social distancing

Lectors will receive Holy Communion on the altar

Ushers – We need ushers to help dismiss parishioners at the end of Mass to receive Holy Communion before exiting the church. We will provide training for anyone new to the role of usher at HSP.

What to know:

All ushers must wear masks
