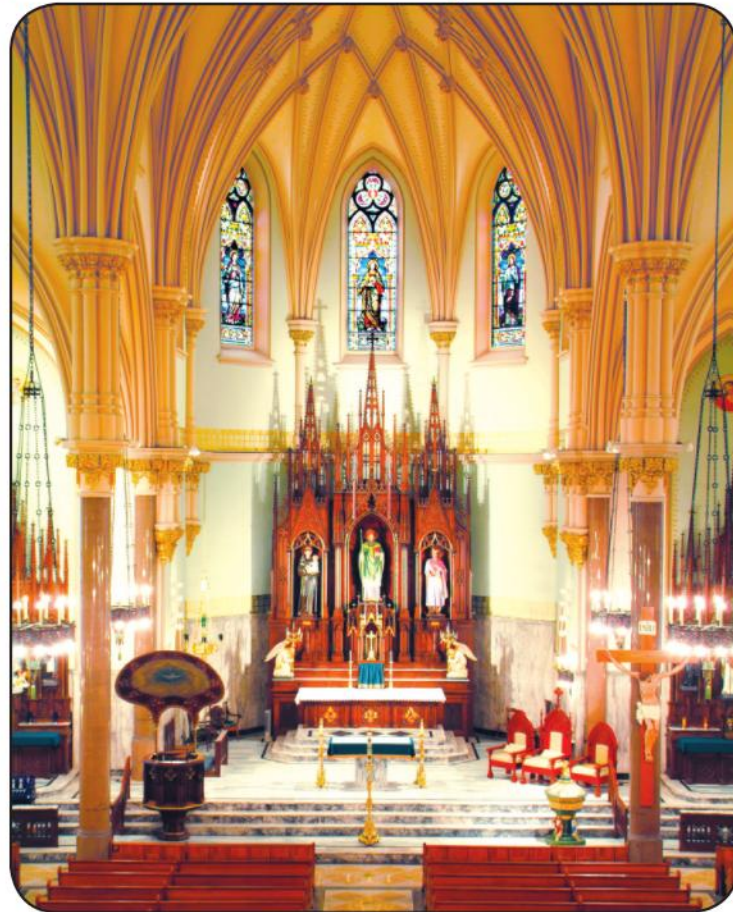

Dear People of God,

The pandemic has certainly changed things for everyone, including the Church. Pandemics are nothing new: they occur every few years or decades. Some are certainly deadly: for example, the Plague killed half of Europe and the Spanish Flu which, I hope you know, was widespread as a result of WWI. Others are barely notable because the effects are far less severe and may not even be noticed. However, the one thing pandemics have in common, well actually two, are these: they are a venture into the unknown and they are frightening to those who are touched by them. In the past many pandemics came and went. No one understood their origin, their transmission dynamics, or much of anything else about them. Today we believe science has all the answers, but when a pandemic begins, science has no answers and is casting about in the dark as much as the rest of us. I mention this because I know that fear is controlling the reactions of many people in our parish and in our community. That's ok if it makes us cautious and careful, but it can be debilitating if the fear begins to dictate our every response and drives us deeper and deeper into isolation.

As our faith reminds us, we humans are a social people. In the Church we are often referred to as "one body in Jesus Christ" and that certainly means togetherness. Finding ways to be "one body" as a parish has challenged all of us. I know many of our committees have been Zooming.

Much of our ordinary content has moved to Facebook. Our celebrations have been live-streamed. These are ways to overcome fear by bringing us together even if we happen to be separated by physical distance. These are the tools we are using to remind ourselves that one of the most common sayings of Jesus is "Do not be afraid."

Fear is paralyzing; it's deadly because it deprives us of the freedom of movement - physical, emotional, intellectual and psychological: we humans so much need to be fully human. On the other hand, the fully human person understands the necessity for what may at times seem drastic measures to assure the safety and health, not so much of the self but of others. Why wear a mask? To protect others from what I may have. Why stand at a distance to carry on a conversation? To respect the dignity and health of the others present. Why stay home when I have the sniffles or a temperature? Because I love my parish enough to avoid contaminating any of those good people. Doing those same things because we're afraid of what we might get may keep us healthy, but it will do little to enhance our sense of participation in the human or Catholic adventure. Remember, fear is not caution and caution should never be fear.

### **The Celebration of Sacraments**

**Infant Baptism:** The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults:** RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

**Penance:** The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony:** Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick:** When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

## Liturgical Ministry Update

With the changes required by the Diocese of Toledo, the role of Liturgical Ministers will be different at our Masses for a while. Eucharistic Ministers will **not** be utilized as Communion will only be the Body of Christ and distributed by the priest and deacon. We will not have a choir, there will be no acolytes and no hospitality after Mass.

There are still ways to answer God's call to ministry, though. Please consider trying a new role at Mass. Once we have the names of the people willing to participate, a new schedule will be created and mailed.

**Liturgical Ministers during COVID-19**

**Lector** – We still need proclaimers of the Word at both the 8 a.m. Mass and 10 a.m. Mass on Sunday mornings. We will happily train anyone interested in serving as lectors who have not read at Mass before.

**What to know:**

Lectors must be age 65 or younger to be on the altar, or willing to sign a waiver

Lectors may read both readings and the stanzas of the psalm

If there are two lectors for Mass, there will be six feet of separation between the seats for proper social distancing

Lectors will receive Holy Communion on the altar

**Ushers** – We need ushers to help dismiss parishioners at the end of Mass to receive Holy Communion before exiting the church. We will provide training for anyone new to the role of usher at HSP.

**What to know:**

All ushers must wear masks

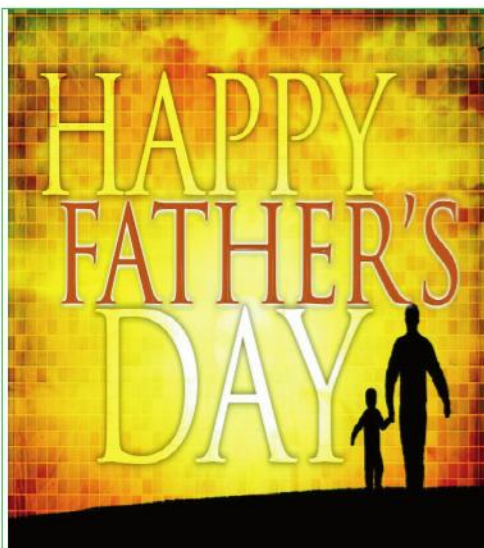
