

Dear People of God,

The Coronavirus has sparked a lot of interesting comments from a lot of people, including a few who have communicated with the Church to offer their considered insights. One person was offended that we were reopening the Church here in Ohio because doing so "will cause the deaths of millions." While hyperbole is a useful grammatical tool, it would be difficult for the Church to kill millions, or even close to that number unless somebody deliberately started spreading the virus and I'm not sure that could even be done.

In fact, Ohio's bishops have been in almost daily contact with the Ohio Health department and its leading scientists who are tracking the virus and its spread. At the outset, the governor did not close churches, synagogues and mosques. He left that to the common sense of their leadership. The bishops could easily have decided that our parishes could continue to celebrate the sacraments using some measures intended to keep people at some distance and minimize the risk of passing on the virus. However, based on what they were hearing from the medical and scientific community, they opted to suspend the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and asked us all to stay home until the virus' worse effects abated.

Continued communication with the best minds on the subject available to them, the bishops have asked us to gather together as safely as possible, each one of us doing his and her best to assure the safety of others. Guidelines provided by those same qualified experts have led to restrictions the bishops believe will help us be true to our faith and true to the suppression of the pandemic. The bishops are aware that there are risks, but they have weighed them against the risks we encounter at the Kroger store, while getting our gardening supplies at Home Depot, at the drive thru picking up a Whopper, or doing any of the other things we've been doing throughout the pandemic lock-down. Life is full of risks, some greater than others. Ohio's bishops are doing their best to make use of the best science has to offer to minimize the risks of the Coronavirus. They've asked all of us to do our part to help in that process. For some that means staying at home for the time being, and that's ok. The bishops understand and have extended the suspension of the obligation through Labor Day. For those at Mass, it means doing much less than we will be doing in the future, sacrificing for the time-being our choirs, processions, sharing the One Cup. We're staying apart and not gathering in large groups after the celebration. We do this because there are risks and all of us want to minimize them to the best of our ability. It's called love of our neighbor.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

<u>Matrimony</u>: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Liturgical Ministers during COVID-19

Lector – We still need proclaimers of the Word at both the 8 a.m. Mass and 10 a.m. Mass on Sunday mornings. We will happily train anyone interested in serving as lectors who have not read at Mass before.

What to know:

Lectors must be age 65 or younger to be on the altar, or willing to sign a waiver

Lectors may read both readings and the stanzas of the psalm

If there are two lectors for Mass, there will be six feet of separation between the seats for proper social distancing

Lectors will receive Holy Communion on the altar

Ushers – We need ushers to help dismiss parishioners at the end of Mass to receive Holy Communion before exiting the church. We will provide training for anyone new to the role of usher at HSP.

All ushers must wear masks

Health News from the Parish Nurse for July 5, 2020

Staying in touch with loved ones in nursing homes and long-term care facilities. In the United States, there are more than 40 million family caregivers, many of whom may be caring for loved ones who may be living in nursing homes or other longterm care facilities. To protect those who are most at risk of complications from the disease caused by the coronavirus, COVID-19, health officials have announced strict rules for some facilities with vulnerable older residents. Following are some tips on how to stay connected to your loved ones: Provide facilities with your most up-to-date emergency contact information. This ensures the facilities can contact you easily, and that facilities can get you all updates about your loved one or the facility at large. Ask what the facility is doing to update families. Read all information that the facility sends out; these may describe systems that have been put in place to help facilitate virtual visits or phone calls.
