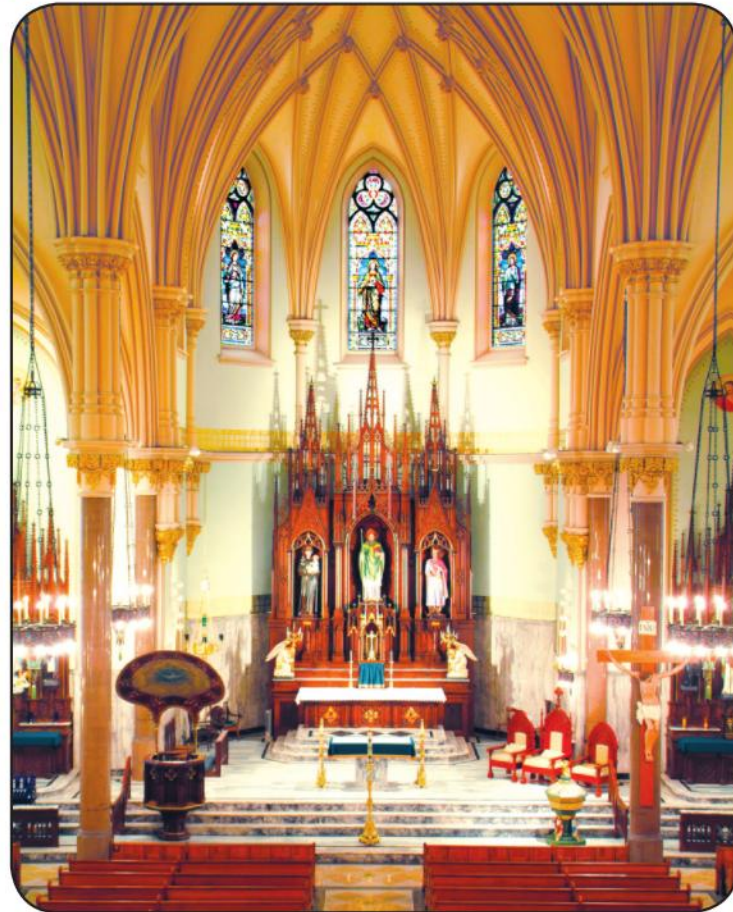

Dear People of God,

This Monday's Old Testament Reading, taken from the Prophet Isaiah, laid into the Hebrews over their attempts to find some new and wonderful way to get God's attention. In essence, Isaiah told them he was sick and tired of their burnt offerings, their moon cycles and other strategies which they borrowed from their neighbors. As he had said many times, he tells the Hebrews he wants behaviors that mirror his own: speak words of justice, comfort the sick, care for the widow. In other words, he tells them to live the Great Command, not give it lip service and pretend to live it by coming up with schemes that make them feel good without accomplishing anything. Without casting aspersions on anyone, we do sometimes find ourselves adopting practices of other churches because we think they might "attract the millennial," "convert Generation X," or achieve some other such goal. We may try a light show, or have espresso before Mass or stage some kind of liturgical movement as part of the entrance, all because we think it may do what God asks us to do. We don't need any of that!

As Catholics we have all the answers to any question of faith anyone might ask. Those answers can be summed up in seven miraculous moments of encounter with God. Why perform circus acts when we have baptism? Why serve coffee, tea or milk when we have Confirmation?

Why install thousands of dollars of lighting equipment when we have Reconciliation? Why hoist monster screens to bring in a guest speaker when we have the best guest possible in Jesus Christ served at every Mass as Eucharist? Yes, we have sacraments. These are *not* mere repetitious ceremonies meant to recall events of the past; they are real contact points between any of us and the creator God. They offer more than a simple contact: they impart that same God into each one of us who with faith accepts the gift of divine presence.

We do not need to invent some new scheme to get the millennials to church - we have the ultimate means in the seven sacraments: God present in life, present in the celebrants, present in you and me. But if we are to make this wonder of God's love and care truly an invitation to others, we must live them ourselves. We must ardently believe that the sacraments are what they are: God coming into us to transform, change and empower us to live the Great Command to love God, love ourselves properly and love our neighbor the same way.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Eucharistic Ministers will **not** be utilized as Communion will only be the Body of Christ and distributed by the priest and deacon. We will not have a choir, there will be no acolytes and no hospitality after Mass.

There are still ways to answer God's call to ministry, though. Please consider trying a new role at Mass. Once we have the names of the people willing to participate, a new schedule will be created and mailed.

Liturgical Ministers during COVID-19

Lector – We still need proclaimers of the Word at both the 8 a.m. Mass and 10 a.m. Mass on Sunday mornings. We will happily train anyone interested in serving as lectors who have not read at Mass before.

What to know:

Lectors must be age 65 or younger to be on the altar, or willing to sign a waiver

Lectors may read both readings and the stanzas of the psalm

If there are two lectors for Mass, there will be six feet of separation between the seats for proper social distancing

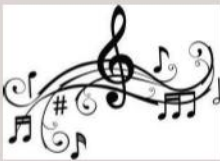
Lectors will receive Holy Communion on the altar

Ushers – We need ushers to help dismiss parishioners at the end of Mass to receive Holy Communion before exiting the church. We will provide training for anyone new to the role of usher at HSP.

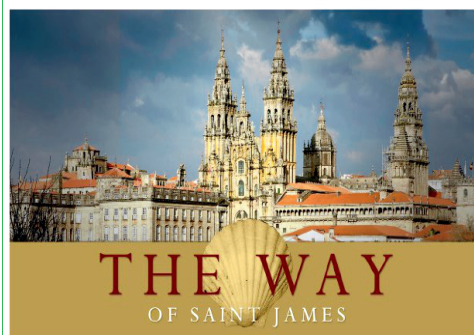
