

Dear People of God,

Last week I wrote about the seven sacraments, a thread I am continuing this week. As I said, the sacraments are truly God resent to us and living within us. That means they are the imposition of God's power in our hands. Have we stopped to consider that? God's love for us is so great that he actually gives us his own divine power and authority. Many of us are no doubt fearful of trying to use that awesome power, thinking we'd make a mess of it. Don't worry about that. We're talking God's power and we need to remind ourselves that his power is that of love, never of hatred, ill-will, or negativity. We cannot use his power for anything but the good which God wants accomplished in the world around us.

Using God's power is simple: all we need to do is live in God's presence. That shouldn't be too hard for us if we think about the fact that we are all made in God's image and likeness. We have built in "default settings" that any person will make use of on a regular basis. These include a kind smile, sharing from our bounty, lifting up someone who's facing troubled times, lending a hand to a neighbor, welcoming the stranger, supporting charities and all those activities we take for granted but which reflect in each of us the image and likeness of our creator. Compassion, forgiveness, love - these are all God activities which we perform without even thinking about doing so. When we add the sacraments to that equation, we open our eyes and our hearts to the reason we do those things and in that openness, we allow God to infiltrate our very being to enlighten us to the next level of those same easy-to-do activities. Compassion is no longer an automatic response to those in some particular need; it's seen and felt and experienced as God acting through us to make a real difference, a miracle in our world. Forgiveness is no longer something we do to feel good and perhaps make others feel good; it's the restoration of relationships which have been sundered in a way that empowers God to create strong bonds of affection and concern. The most important of these behaviors raised to a new level of excellence in the sacraments is love. This is not the love we see portrayed on TV and in the movies or which has become an industry that distorts and distracts us from genuine love; instead, it is the love of God which is creative, healing, generous, self-sacrificial and ultimately the gift of the very self to others.



The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

With the changes required by the Diocese of Toledo, the role of Liturgical Ministers will be different at our Masses for a while. Eucharistic Ministers will not be utilized as Communion will only be the Body of Christ and distributed by the priest and deacon. We will not have a choir, there will be no aco-
lytes and no hospitality after Mass.
There are still ways to answer God's call to ministry, though. Please consider trying a new role at Mass. Once we have the names of the people willing to participate, a new schedule will be created and mailed.

Liturgical Ministers during COVID-19
Lector – We still need proclaimers of the Word at both the 8 a.m. Mass and 10 a.m. Mass on Sunday mornings. We will happily train anyone interested
in serving as lectors who have not read at Mass before.
<i>What to know:</i> Lectors must be age 65 or younger to be on the altar, or willing to sign a waiver
Lectors may read both readings and the stanzas of the psalm
If there are two lectors for Mass, there will be six feet of separation between the seats for proper social distancing
Lectors will receive Holy Communion on the altar
Ushers - We need ushers to help dismiss parishioners at the end of Mass to receive Holy Communion before exiting the church. We will provide train-
ing for anyone new to the role of usher at HSP.
What to know:
All ushers must wear masks

Health News from the Parish Nurse for July 26, 2020

Staying in touch with loved ones in nursing homes and long-term care facilities: Support the facility staff and work together.

Facilities might be short staffed and dealing with new operating procedures, and this is a hard time for them as well. Staff at nursing homes and assisted living centers are on the front lines of the coronavirus outbreak, caring for your loved ones and their own families every day. Thank them for their care, and your loved one also might want to express their appreciation too. Talk together about what they might want to give or what they see as a need for staff. Talk with staffers about what they need or are allowed to receive. Raise concerns about care and rights violations with facility administration and with the long-term care ombudsman program. Complaints can also be filed with the state Department of Health, although due to new guidance from CMS, follow up will likely be delayed if not in one of priority areas for the survey.


