

Dear People of God,

I hope you took the opportunity all this past week to consider the beginnings you've made and how they are intended to enhance holiness, yours and that of others. You might want to check up on this by reading the sections of the documents of II Vatican Council on the "Universal Call to Holiness." (Lumen gentium 40. If you have the Catechism, you can look up holiness, around paragraph 2013 and following). Having taken a quick look at Baptism, let's move on to the second of the three "sacraments of imitation:" Confirmation.

Confirmation seals us with the presence and spiritual strength of the Holy Spirit enabling us to better understand and make use of the Gifts of the Holy Spirit (hmm, ever wonder why there are seven?) These gifts are universal, present in all times and places and hopefully in some form in all human beings. In Confirmation they take on a much richer sense of place in what we do and why we do it. This enhancement occurs when we commit ourselves to making it occur: we have to want to accept the Holy Spirit in the sacrament. Consider all the times, events, and moments that are associated with us humans making agreements, commitments, contracts and other relationships which require us to hand over some element of ourselves to another. We begin a friendship, but it takes energy and sacrifice to make that friendship actually last longer than the time it took to say hello. In fact, most of the beginnings we undertake on a regular basis will then demand that we make some sort of a commitment to make the beginning last into the future.

That should inform us that by the grace of the sacrament, we are reminded that God makes holy all commitments which engage us in long-term, or even short term, action. Did you ever buy a car or a house? Did you then undertake to pay for it, perhaps with a forty year mortgage or a three year paydown on that new car? Did you begin a Bible Study and attend the classes until the series was completed? Did you set out for Cedar Point and enjoy a day or more there? Did you agree to come to Alpha and then do so over the weeks long event? The commitments to accomplish those ends, and hundreds of others we probably never stopped to think about, are made holy or should be seen as holy as they reflect the commitment and energy of Confirmation.

We Catholics believe that marriage is in and of itself a special sacrament bringing the majesty, power and love of Jesus into the bond formed between husband and wife. However, the Church believes all marriages are holy because they are so human an activity. They begin even before the wadding but certainly take on a special significance with the marriage ceremony and then demand a commitment which calls for self-sacrifice and putting something of oneself into the partnership formed by consent.

Consider the beginnings and ensuing actions to make that beginning take on a life of its own. Have they helped you see holiness all around you? Think "yes" to inspire consideration of how that sense of holiness all around you enriches your life.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

<u>Matrimony</u>: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

We will not have a choir, there will be no acolvtes and no hospitality after Mass.

There are still ways to answer God's call to ministry, though. Please consider trying a new role at Mass. Once we have the names of the people willing to participate, a new schedule will be created and mailed.

Liturgical Ministers during COVID-19

Lector – We still need proclaimers of the Word at both the 8 a.m. Mass and 10 a.m. Mass on Sunday mornings. We will happily train anyone interested in serving as lectors who have not read at Mass before.

What to know:

Lectors must be age 65 or younger to be on the altar, or willing to sign a waiver

Lectors may read both readings and the stanzas of the psalm

If there are two lectors for Mass, there will be six feet of separation between the seats for proper social distancing

Lectors will receive Holy Communion on the altar

Ushers – We need ushers to help dismiss parishioners at the end of Mass to receive Holy Communion before exiting the church. We will provide training for anyone new to the role of usher at HSP.

What to know:

All ushers must wear masks

Let us pray for the repose of the souls of Fr. Steve and Mr. Chiles, May they rest in peace.



Like Mary, We Bring Christ to the World



Francis recognized that there are two moments in our life with God. There is the moment when we are passive, when God's grace overwhelms us, when we are forgiven, when we receive our new life in Christ. At this moment God is active; God does for us what we could never do for ourselves. But there is another moment when we become active, when we respond to God's grace, when we become sources of blessing in the lives of others, when we share the new life we have received, namely, Christ. We are then the Mothers of Christ. We receive Christ as Mary did, by God's grace, but then like Mary we are to bring Christ forth, to present Christ to a world in need. Francis' Marian spirituality was not limited to singing Mary's praises. It moved Francis to action, to share with those in need. Our shrines to Mary ought to be the shelters for the homeless who share her poverty. Our words in praise of Mary ought to be the words and deeds we say and do to bring an end to war and terrorism in the name of the Queen of Peace. Our pilgrimages in her honor might be a walk for the poor. And although Francis' words about Mary are steeped in the sentiment characteristic of the church of his day, his piety went far beyond mere sentiment.
