


Dear People of God,

There are seven sacraments and I'm continuing a theory of why there are and will always be just seven. I've taken a very superficial look at Baptism and Confirmation and now want to examine the third of the three "Sacraments of Initiation:" Eucharist. The Eucharistic celebration offers us the body and blood, humanity and divinity of Jesus Christ. It's the real presence, Jesus made one with each of us who partakes of the sacred meal and uniting each one of us with all the others who share at the table of the Lord, past, present and future. Therein lies the connection to another common human activity: the meals we share with one another.

In many ancient cultures sharing a meal was so important that if you accepted an invitation to dine with someone, you could never then go to war with the other dinner guests. Sharing of food was considered a sacred bond of unity even before the institution of the Eucharist. Of course, this arises from the absolute necessity of food for us humans. But stop to consider how we've ritualized our food so it's pleasant to see and even more so when we put on the Ritz for guests. We humans aren't satisfied grazing over the plains or rending fresh meat from the still quivering body of prey. We prefer to slice, dice, chop, mix, blend, roast, bake, grill and all those other methods we've developed to make a meal far more than a chance to merely consume a few morsels. Even so-called "fast food" is served up in colorful, attractive containers and wrappers. Consider also that very few of us enjoy eating our meals alone. If nothing else, we like to have the "company" of the daily newspaper or its electronic equivalent. Food is among the most common elements which bind us to other human beings, whether it's because we cook their food, serve their food, share their food or clean up after.

Our sacrament of Eucharist reminds us that all the other meals we share are holy and can dispense holiness. When we sit at Burger King or some other favorite place enjoying that Whopper or Big Mac, even when alone at our table these pandemic days, we're still surrounded by others. Perhaps we are at a greater distance, but others are there and so we share a kind of common unity. When we enjoy a nice steak at Mancy's or one of the large chain places "out west" along Airport Highway, we're sharing the fundamental binding force of humanity which can be distinctly holy. Even a quick sandwich at International Park leads us to think about other people, maybe those walking the edge of the river or those we wish were with us, but once again we're uniting ourselves to others in what is a basic human activity. Eucharist, which is the ultimate unity of God and humanity and a tremendous gift for each of us who share at the table, should remind us every time we celebrate that all our other meals are made holy and can be a source of greater holiness for others. No wonder the Church asks us to say a prayer of blessing before we begin those other meals!

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Liturgical Ministry Update With the changes required by the Diocese of Toledo, the role of Liturgical Ministers will be different at our Masses for a while. Eucharistic Ministers will not be utilized as Communion will only be the Body of Christ and distributed by the priest and deacon. We will not have a choir, there will be no acolytes and no hospitality after Mass. There are still ways to answer God's call to ministry, though. Please consider trying a new role at Mass. Once we have the names of the people willing to participate, a new schedule will be created and mailed. Look forward to seeing you! Msgr. Chris Liturgical Ministers during COVID-19 Lector - We still need proclaimers of the Word at both the 8 a.m. Mass and 10 a.m. Mass on Sunday mornings. We will happily train anyone interested in serving as lectors who have not read at Mass before. What to know: Lectors must be age 65 or younger to be on the altar, or willing to sign a waiver Lectors may read both readings and the stanzas of the psalm If there are two lectors for Mass, there will be six feet of separation between the seats for proper social distancing Lectors will receive Holy Communion on the altar Ushers - We need ushers to help dismiss parishioners at the end of Mass to receive Holy Communion before exiting the church. We will provide training for anyone new to the role of usher at HSP. What to know: All ushers must wear masks How to sign up - Call Sherri in the Parish Office at 419.243.6452, or talk to Pat Thompson, Mary Kay McPartlin or Martha Farrell after Mass

You continue to be dispensed from your obligation to attend Sunday Mass until further notice.


