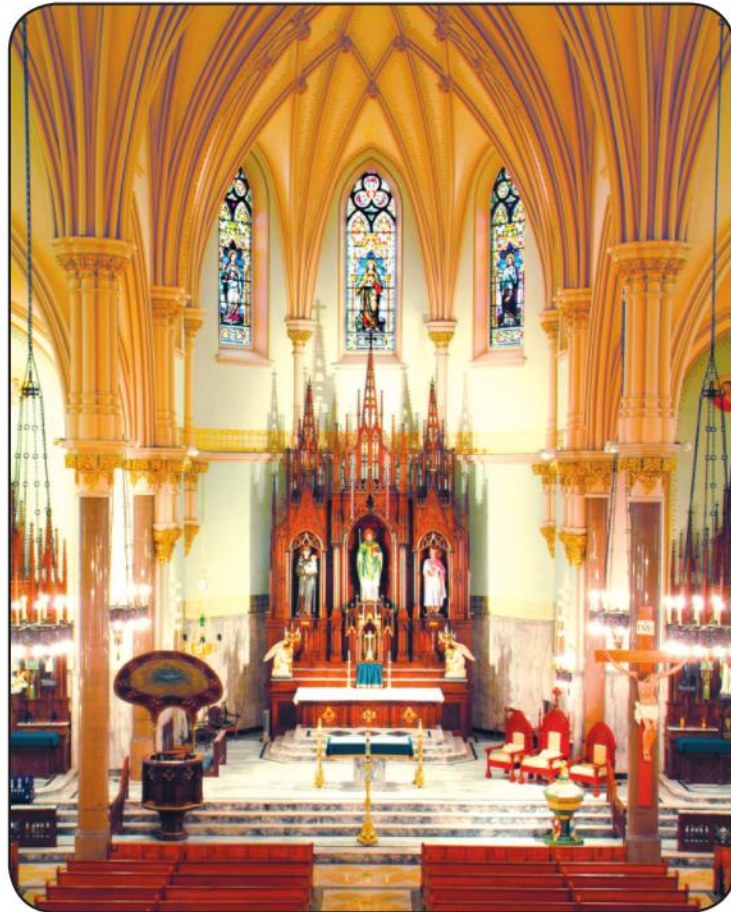

Dear People of God,

There are seven sacraments and I have hazarded a guess that there are seven of them because we humans essentially undertake seven ordinary behaviors that represent human life. I suggest that by giving us sacraments, Jesus reminds us that holiness can be found in any of those ordinary behaviors. So far I've gone through (1) Baptism = beginnings (2) Confirmation = commitments, contracts, agreements (3) Eucharist = meals, sharing food with others (4) Marriage = friendships, interpersonal relationships, the life-long bonds represented by marriage (5) Reconciliation = all those moments when we apologize, say we're sorry. etc.

Today I want to look at the other sacrament of healing, the Anointing of the Sick. The sacrament used to be called Extreme Unction and was considered the famous "last rites." I would suggest that a common human behavior, in fact two represented by this one sacrament, are all those good byes we say when events in life roll around to an end. Think of the wishes that accompany the little girl heading off to kindergarten for the first time, or the hopes that go with the young recruit heading off to basic training among numerous other moments of separation. We humans take time to note when we separate and those good byes are made holy by the sanctification of the ultimate good byes celebrated in the sacrament.

On the other hand, most people today make use of the sacrament as a sign of the power of God to heal our wounds. As human beings, we take a lot of time, energy and money undertaking behaviors meant to invoke the power of healing. We turn to doctors for physical healing, to psychologists for mental healing, to counselors for emotional and affective healing, and which of us has not run to Mom when we were little kids asking her to kiss away a boo-boo? Humanity behaves in a healing manner because which Mom didn't invoke the awesome power of motherhood to kiss away that tiny scrape or cut?

I would suggest that by giving us the sacrament of anointing, Jesus means for us to understand that all acts of healing are in some way already holy and lead us closer to the divine and the state of holiness to which all humans aspire (or should), perhaps not as close as we can achieve by using the sacrament, but closer nonetheless. Remember, I began this series by citing the Beatitudes in Matthew - actions which Jesus reminds us are already holy and deserve the further explanation provided by the Church Jesus expects his Apostles to establish. Have you been thinking of some other ordinary human behavior that isn't covered by one of these six of the seven sacraments? Allow your understanding of the roles these behaviors play in your life to enrich your appreciation of the more important role the sacraments also have in your life.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Liturgical Ministers during COVID-19

Lector – We still need proclaimers of the Word at both the 8 a.m. Mass and 10 a.m. Mass on Sunday mornings. We will happily train anyone interested in serving as lectors who have not read at Mass before.

What to know:

Lectors must be age 65 or younger to be on the altar, or willing to sign a waiver

Lectors may read both readings and the stanzas of the psalm

If there are two lectors for Mass, there will be six feet of separation between the seats for proper social distancing

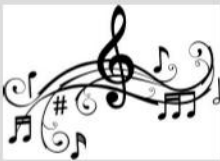
Lectors will receive Holy Communion on the altar

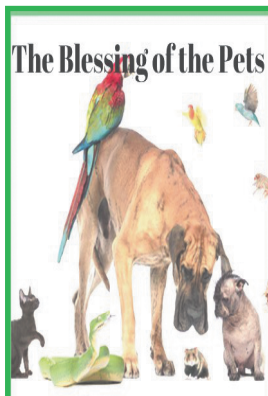

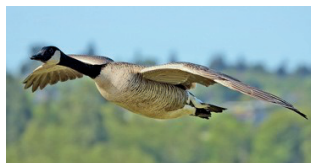
