Dear People of God,

Today I will come to the conclusion of my series on the sacraments and how they have a broader effect out in the real world by discussing Holy Orders, the laying on of hands which imparts the priestly or diaconal ministry to those called to the sacrament by their diocesan bishop. Psychologists are baffled by the universal sense all humans seem to have that there is a divine beyond us humans and that the divine can be accessed or approached via the sacred person, the priest, sachem, oracle or prophet. To Skinnerian psychologists who believe that everything we do is a simple response to some external stimulus, the sense of the divine makes no sense so they try to explain it away along with a lot of other human behavior that does not fit the stimulus-response scenario.,

I would suggest that in giving us the sacrament of Holy Orders, Jesus intends for us to discover the goal lodged in all attempts to come to grips with the divine, whether that be knowing God better, feeling God's presence or recognizing the wonders God has done in the created order. If we truly believe that God is the founder/creator of all that is, all that is would have to be holy because the font of holiness (God) created it. God cannot create unholiness. Getting in contact with the holiness which enfolds any specific activity in which we engage is sometimes difficult so in Holy Orders, the priest/ deacon imparts sacramental grace through behaviors which mirror those of our daily lives. Priesthood seems to be a unique status in every culture. Certain people are summoned, called or chosen because of their suitability to commune more directly with the divine. Most make use of very carefully orchestrated rituals in order to assure the proper dispensation of knowledge, grace or transformation each time that ritual is manifested among the people. For example, the Mass looks the same because we want the same result; that reutilization is among the most common human activities of them all. Stop to consider how ritualized your life is. You may call it routine, or an agenda, or a plan, or a common way to make the day run more smoothly, and that's the point. We get to the result we want in a way that assures us of obtaining the end we want. We all have a favorite restaurant where we order a favorite food, a favorite TV show or football team, a favorite song that sparks a favorite memory, and that's ritual; Holy Orders signals that our behaviors, ritualized as they become, are part of our path to holiness.



The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Eucharistic Ministers will not be utilized as Communion will only be the Body of Christ and distributed by the priest and deacon. We will not have a choir, there will be no acolytes and no hospitality after Mass. There are still ways to answer God's call to ministry, though. Please consider trying a new role at Mass. Once we have the names of the people willing to participate, a new schedule will be created and mailed. Look forward to seeing you! Msgr. Chris Liturgical Ministers during COVID-19 Lector - We still need proclaimers of the Word at both the 8 a.m. Mass and 10 a.m. Mass on Sunday mornings. We will happily train anyone interested in serving as lectors who have not read at Mass before. What to know: Lectors must be age 65 or younger to be on the altar, or willing to sign a waiver Lectors may read both readings and the stanzas of the psalm If there are two lectors for Mass, there will be six feet of separation between the seats for proper social distancing Lectors will receive Holy Communion on the altar Ushers - We need ushers to help dismiss parishioners at the end of Mass to receive Holy Communion before exiting the church. We will provide training for anyone new to the role of usher at HSP. What to know: All ushers must wear masks How to sign up - Call Sherri in the Parish Office at 419.243.6452, or talk to Pat Thompson, Mary Kay McPartlin or Martha Farrell after Mass
