

Dear People of God,

I was struck the other day reading Paul's letter to the Corinthians that the Church hasn't matured very much over the last 2000 years. Of course, given that it's a church for eternity, it's still in its infancy so that's to be expected; however, what hit me was the introduction where Paul rails against the factions that have developed in the local church, part favoring Paul and another Apollos. Elsewhere he'll add those who follow Cephas (Peter). Those are the leaders of the community or communities which are coalescing in Corinth. Paul wonders why the people are looking to mere humans instead of looking to God for leadership/quidance/perfection. It's not a new trend; you can see the same thing happening in the Old Testament over and over: recall the moment Cain and Abel begin to divide the human family, note Isaac and Ishmael both claiming the better connection to Abraham and the Covenant, and then remember the Pharisees and Sadducees arguing over who best represented God's Church in the Israel of Jesus' time. We see this same phenomenon today when the parish priest is moved on and some people follow him to another parish rather than continue to find God in the one they were at.

This same kind of division occurs when some want to stick with the "tried and the true" Latin Mass and others do their best to incorporate their worship in the Vatican II liturgy celebrated in the vernacular. It goes right to the top. There are those who accept Francis as Holy Father and others who follow along with those who insist that there is no real pope because Vatican II messed up everything. Jesus, or as Paul reminds the Corinthians, the Christ is supposed to be the image held before our eyes regardless of anything or anyone else. Jesus is the model and goal of our Christian pilgrimage. Jesus is the very real presence within that transforms us and makes us very real partakers in the divinity. Yet we have time and energy to squabble over mere humans and their modeling or whatever flaws we cite or differences we imagine. Our time and energy ought to be focused on, again as Paul says, the deeds which we do to make known the wonder of God. Our modeling of the partnership we share with Jesus should be made evident to others by the way we speak and act. Our following the Christ should be focused on celebrating as best we can the rites, rituals and sacraments which bring about the connection between us and the God we worship.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.


Liturgical Ministry Update With the changes required by the Diocese of Toledo, the role of Liturgical Ministers will be different at our Masses for a while. Eucharistic Ministers will not be utilized as Communion will only be the Body of Christ and distributed by the priest and deacon. We will not have a choir, there will be no acolytes and no hospitality after Mass. There are still ways to answer God's call to ministry, though. Please consider trying a new role at Mass. Once we have the names of the people willing to participate, a new schedule will be created and mailed. Look forward to seeing you! Msgr. Chris Liturgical Ministers during COVID-19 Lector - We still need proclaimers of the Word at both the 8 a.m. Mass and 10 a.m. Mass on Sunday mornings. We will happily train anyone interested in serving as lectors who have not read at Mass before. What to know: Lectors must be age 65 or younger to be on the altar, or willing to sign a waiver Lectors may read both readings and the stanzas of the psalm If there are two lectors for Mass, there will be six feet of separation between the seats for proper social distancing Lectors will receive Holy Communion on the altar Ushers - We need ushers to help dismiss parishioners at the end of Mass to receive Holy Communion before exiting the church. We will provide training for anyone new to the role of usher at HSP. Health News from the Parish Nurse for October 4, 2020

COVID-19 Fraud. COVID-19 fraud is rapidly evolving. The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Office of Inspector General is alerting the public about fraud schemes related to the novel coronavirus (COVID-19). Scammers are offering COVID-19 tests to Medicare beneficiaries in exchange for personal details, including Medicare information. However, the services are unapproved and illegitimate. Fraudsters are targeting beneficiaries in a number of ways, including telemarketing calls, text messages, social media platforms, and door-to-door visits. These scammers use the coronavirus pandemic to benefit themselves, and beneficiaries face potential harms. The personal information collected can be used to fraudulently bill Federal health care programs and commit medical identity theft. If Medicare or Medicaid denies the claim for an unapproved test, the beneficiary could be responsible for the cost.
