

Dear People of God,

As we gather for today's combined Mass honoring and praying for all first responders, we find ourselves in a truly different world. Pandemic, raging forest fires, hurricanes, social unrest on the streets - all of which have stressed our first responders to the edge and tragically claimed the lives of far too many of them. Our celebration is saddened by the harsh reality that the risks of serving others often demands the ultimate sacrifice. All of us here at the Historic Church of St. Patrick pray constantly for the safety of our first responders and, when necessary, for the repose of the souls of those who have suffered the loss of life doing their best to protect the rest of us. This year we have so far recorded sixty-eight firefighter deaths here in the US. One hundred and seventeen officers have died from Coronavirus and thirty seven were killed by gunshot, one, Officer Anthony Dia right here in Toledo. These losses are truly a tragedy for family, friends, co-workers and for all who care about the dignity of human life. We salute them all and pray for them and their families.

It is especially good to be here with our local and regional first responders, holding a combined service which includes the annual Mass for Law Enforcement we had to delay due to the Pandemic and the recently delayed Firefighters Mass usually held in early September to coincide with the anniversary of 9/11 and the lightening strike which took down our majestic steeple back in 1980.

We're delighted to have our guests with us to join in music, song and prayer understandably muted a bit by the necessities of social distancing and caution with regard to the virulence of the Coronavirus. We Catholics are often accused of putting too much faith in God and not enough in science, but in the case of an unknown, dangerous disease, we truly believe our faith in a loving God will lead that merciful God to intervene to show science the way to the end of the Pandemic. All the gifts of science are, after all, God's creation. The men and women on the scent of a cure are God's creation. The vaccines which will be developed are the result of talents and skills implanted by God himself, so why not put faith in God as a high priority?

We offer our thanks and support to the women and men who daily take the risks the rest of don't and offer our prayers for their well-being. May this day and this celebration raise your spirit and lend you the strength of an entire community.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Liturgical Ministers during COVID-19

Lector – We still need proclaimers of the Word at both the 8 a.m. Mass and 10 a.m. Mass on Sunday mornings. We will happily train anyone interested in serving as lectors who have not read at Mass before.

What to know:

Lectors must be age 65 or younger to be on the altar, or willing to sign a waiver

Lectors may read both readings and the stanzas of the psalm

If there are two lectors for Mass, there will be six feet of separation between the seats for proper social distancing

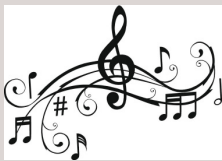
Lectors will receive Holy Communion on the altar

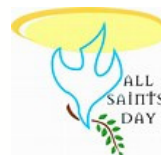
