

Dear People of God,

"Do not be afraid." "Don't be afraid of it."

Is there any difference between these sentiments? Essentially no. Each is short, to the point and simply put. Why are they commonly spoken (for ex., by Mom to comfort a child when some mysterious noise pops out of the dark, by the doctor an hour or two before surgery, and by many others for a range of reasons throughout our lives)? Why? Because fear has invaded the human condition.

I truly believe that fear is the bitter, rotten fruit of the tree of good and evil, its noxious bile coursing through our veins to disrupt and threaten our spiritual and physiological equilibrium. We can trace fear back in the sacred works of the Bible and discover that the brilliant author of Genesis makes a clear connection between fear and shame. Remember. when God comes looking for Adam post apple eating, he's hiding, afraid to be seen, ashamed of what he sees, not in God or the garden but in himself: "I saw that I was naked." So what? He was naked to God before he ate the apple, while he was enjoying the crisp, sweet, juicy taste of that fruit and after nothing remained but the core. God made Adam so God knew what he looked like from top to bottom (whether that bottom was out for public view or hidden behind a tightly grasped fig leaf) and as far as God was concerned, every bit of Adam was beautiful to behold. When seen beside Eve, the symmetry is so magnificent that it was powerful enough to replicate creation itself. So then, why the fear?

I believe it's because fear is the ultimate deadly reality which led a famous American to boldly state, "We have nothing to fear but fear itself."

Fear is deadly because it prevents our ears from hearing that single wrong note in the symphony of sound, the single note that would trigger an awakening to the correction needed to restore the perfect harmony. Fear blinds our eyes to the golden light of truth glimmering in the wealth of visible but often misleading or distracting reality. Fear blunts our taste to the missing spice in a favorite dish, the subtle but crucial lack that points us to the missing ingredient necessary to restore the perfect flavor blend. Fear negatively alters our experience of many of life's pleasures.

The first of the quotes above is from the Bible. It's a command given by God himself; a little exploration on the FORMED platform will reveal that God commands us "not to be afraid." He does so about seventy times, underscoring two key ideas; (1) the difficulty we humans have encountered in our efforts to successfully banish this crippling emotion and (2) the absolute necessity of actually doing so, banishing fear from our lives because it doesn't belong there. There are some other words we hear at Church posted here by way of conclusion: "Heed the words of the Gospels."

What's the human behavior we ought to cultivate instead of caving in to fear? I'll be exploring that next weekend but until then, consider what fears touch you and how you try to conquer them. And never forget God's advice: Be not afraid.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.



Liturgical Ministry Update With the changes required by the Diocese of Toledo, the role of Liturgical Ministers will be different at our Masses for a while. Eucharistic Ministers will not be utilized as Communion will only be the Body of Christ and distributed by the priest and deacon. We will not have a choir, there will be no acolytes and no hospitality after Mass. There are still ways to answer God's call to ministry, though. Please consider trying a new role at Mass. Once we have the names of the people willing to participate, a new schedule will be created and mailed. Look forward to seeing you! Msgr. Chris Liturgical Ministers during COVID-19 Lector - We still need proclaimers of the Word at both the 8 a.m. Mass and 10 a.m. Mass on Sunday mornings. We will happily train anyone interested in serving as lectors who have not read at Mass before. What to know: Lectors must be age 65 or younger to be on the altar, or willing to sign a waiver Lectors may read both readings and the stanzas of the psalm If there are two lectors for Mass, there will be six feet of separation between the seats for proper social distancing Lectors will receive Holy Communion on the altar Ushers - We need ushers to help dismiss parishioners at the end of Mass to receive Holy Communion before exiting the church. We will provide training for anyone new to the role of usher at HSP. What to know: All ushers must wear masks How to sign up - Call Sherri in the Parish Office at 419.243.6452, or talk to Pat Thompson, Mary Kay McPartlin or Martha Farrell after Mass

First Millennial to be Beatified by the Catholic Church

Carlo Acutis, a young Italian computer whiz, died of Leukemia at the age of 15 in 2006. At a young age, Carlo taught himself how to build computer programs and went on to create websites cataloging the world's Eucharistic miracles and Marian apparitions.

He was beatified on October 10, 2020 and is one step closer to canonization. His feast day will be celebrated on October 12, the anniversary of his death.

Some of Carlo's favorite sayings were:

* "All people are born originals, but many live as photocopies."

* "The more Eucharist we receive, the more we will become like Jesus, so that on earth we will have a foretaste of heaven."

* "The only thing we have to ask God for, in prayer, is the desire to be holy."
