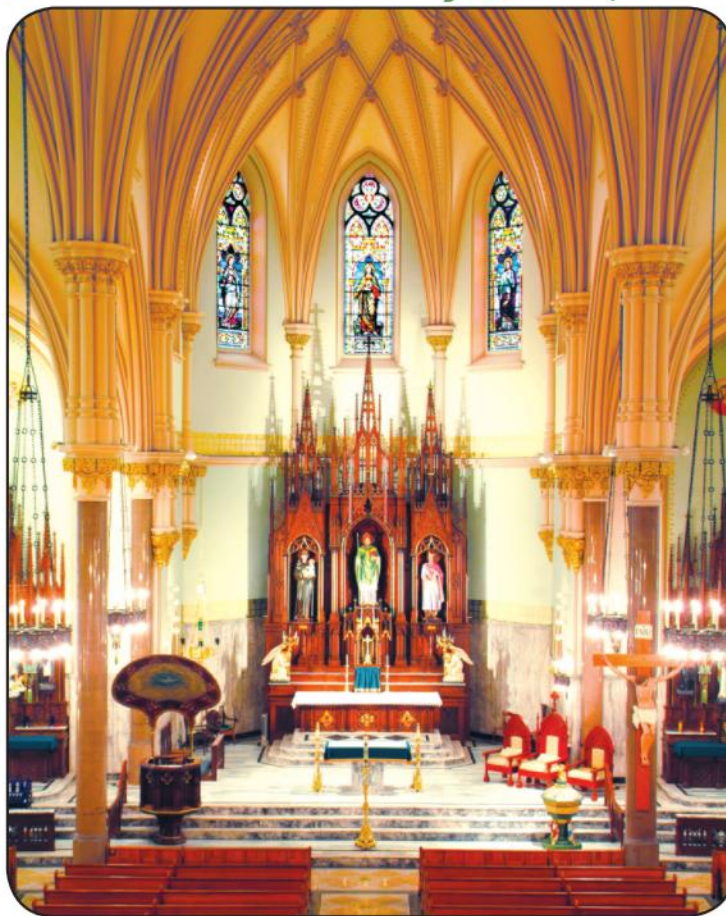

Dear People of God,

I hope you've all been perusing the wide array of materials coming out from the Church about responsible voting. Although many are unaware of this, the Church is tongue-tied when it comes to endorsing particular people for office by the restrictions of its 501(c)(3) (non-profit) designation. Because certain candidates are so intimately connected to particular issues, the Church is often tongue-tied by that same ruling because to comment on the issue would be to tacitly comment on the candidate. It makes election time particularly difficult for the Church and its ministers who from time to time would function as a spokesperson for the parish or diocese. Nevertheless, the importance of so many of today's hot-button topics inspired the diocese to issue the non-partisan "Conscience and the Catholic Voter" series. Each of the 8 pages analyzes ideas relevant to a particular subject currently being debated. We provided access in our email bulletins and by including the pages in the actual weekly paper bulletin. Because many will have voted before the 8 week series would have ended, we elected to provide access over 3 weeks: Intro and #1 on Sept 20; #2-5 on Sept 27; and #6-8 on Oct 4. See the link on our website at www.stpatshistoric.org if you still wish to access these informative pages.

If I may dive back into history, I recall the edgy days when the first viable Catholic candidate for the presidency was nominated and the Church went wild with joy. There had been innumerable Catholics involved in the government of the United States from its very beginning.

One of the most articulate signers of the Declaration of Independence was a Catholic. During the Civil War a Catholic priest served as the government's official representative to the native American peoples. The first Catholic Justice of the Supreme Court was appointed by President Andrew Johnson (the current make-up of the Court is six Catholics, two Jews and one Episcopalian). However, with the nomination of John Kennedy, waves of anti-Catholic vitriol spouted from a lot of public figures while in the Church, where the restrictions of 501(c)(3) had not yet been devised, we were all but told it would be a sin not to vote for him (not that I could vote at the age of 12). The priest in our little Swanton parish was ecstatic at the nomination, openly enthusiastic about the election and positively effusive in his praise of the outcome.

Those days of publicly endorsing a candidate are long gone and in all likelihood will not be returning soon, but I do hope everyone of age to vote is studying platforms and programs and promises closely rather than merely picking a candidate because he or she came off better in a brief sound bite or struck a better pose on a poster or came up with a catchier slogan. Elections are serious and have profound results that go far beyond slogans or personalities, not just for those who supported the winner, but for those who will live under the laws enacted by the party which gains control of Congress, the Statehouse, counties and towns. Please take time to do your homework, don't rush to judgment, and above all, please exercise the important right to vote.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

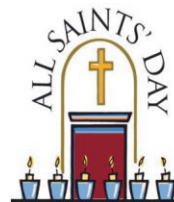

If there are two lectors for Mass, there will be six feet of separation between the seats for proper social distancing

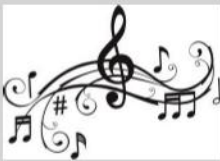
Lectors will receive Holy Communion on the altar

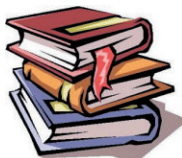

Since we will be preparing the food bags in advance this year, not as many volunteers will be needed on distribution day.

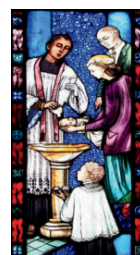
