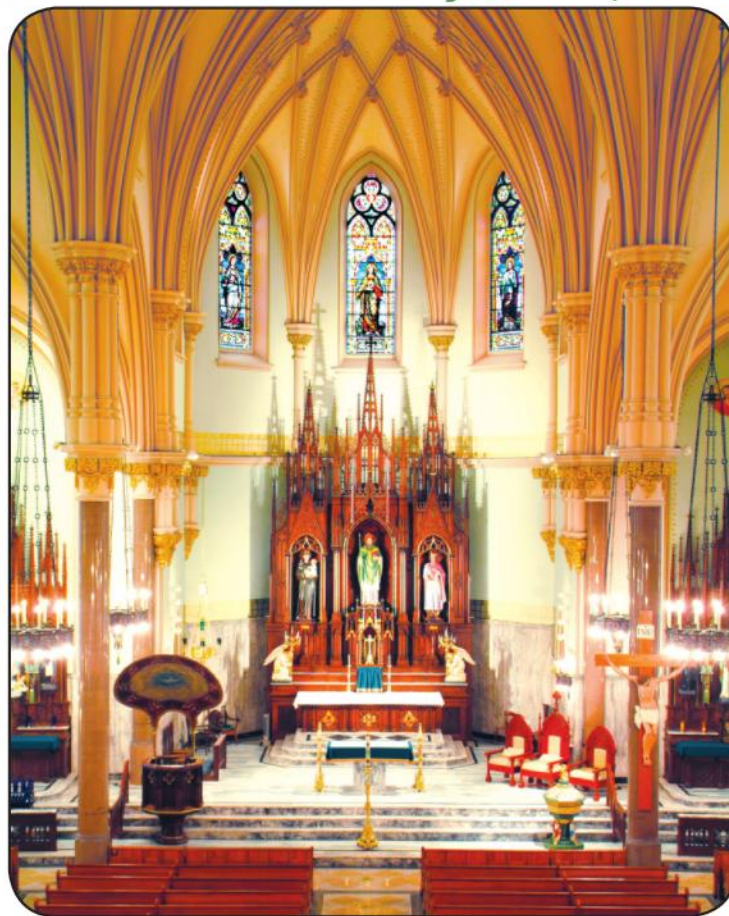

Dear People of God,

Since we've been using the Apostles' Creed at mass this past several weeks, I've gotten a couple of regular questions regarding this ancient testament to our faith in the Triune God. The first has to do with the phrase "he descended into hell." The second goes something like this "Why hasn't anyone caught the typo in the phrase "one, holy, catholic Church...?" the typo being the small case "c" on catholic.

The Apostles Creed, while credited to the Twelve, is from the earliest period of the active Church; since it is probably a second or third century prayer, it retains some of the theological theories of that age. Among these was the notion of Hades, the place dead people went whether good or bad. Hades was divided into various levels with the good folks going to the Elysian Fields where they were treated royally while the bad people, depending on how bad they were, went to one of the other sides of Hades where they were punished for their misdeeds in this life. You may recall that this theory of the different levels inspired Dante to compose his descriptive narration of the levels of hell. In fact, there's a reference to this interconnected after-life in the gospels in the story of Lazarus the beggar and the rich man who both die and can see and communicate with one another across a great, impassable chasm. This is the concept behind the line in the prayer: Jesus goes to this common area and takes all the good people to heaven with him in the resurrection.

The second question has to do with the meaning of the word "catholic." It's a Greek word and means "universal." When the word begins with an upper case "C," it means us: the Roman Catholic Church and all the other Catholic churches in communion with the Pope. On the other hand, our faith is in a truly universal Church consisting of all the people who place their faith in God whether they belong to our Catholic Church or not. A famous German theologian (Karl Rahner in case you want to go to the FORMED platform and look up some of his work - I had the opportunity to be at a lecture he gave and it was way above my head) developed the theory of the "anonymous Christian" during the era of the Second Vatican Council to try to explain how God works the salvation of those who do not openly profess Jesus Christ but who are still saved because they are part of this one, holy, catholic Church.

Speaking of the Council, every gathering of the Bishops in an ecumenical council will result in a Profession of Faith, a Creed similar to and probably based on the Constantinopolitan-Nicean Creed we generally see used at Mass. You can find it in the Documents of II Vatican Council on the internet or try researching the Council and its work on the FORMED platform. In the meantime, when we use the Apostles' Creed at mass or when you say it among your own prayers or at the beginning of the rosary, think of the joy of Jesus descending to a part of hell to bring the good deceased to heaven with him.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

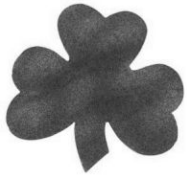

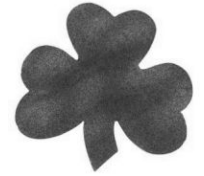

Liturgical Ministers during COVID-19

Lector – We still need proclaimers of the Word at both the 8 a.m. Mass and 10 a.m. Mass on Sunday mornings. We will happily train anyone interested in serving as lectors who have not read at Mass before.

Lectors must be age 65 or younger to be on the altar, or willing to sign a waiver

Lectors may read both readings and the stanzas of the psalm

If there are two lectors for Mass, there will be six feet of separation between the seats for proper social distancing

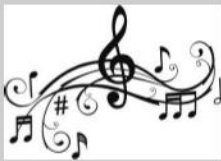
Lectors will receive Holy Communion on the altar

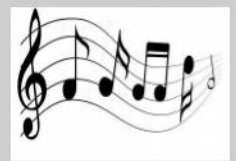
