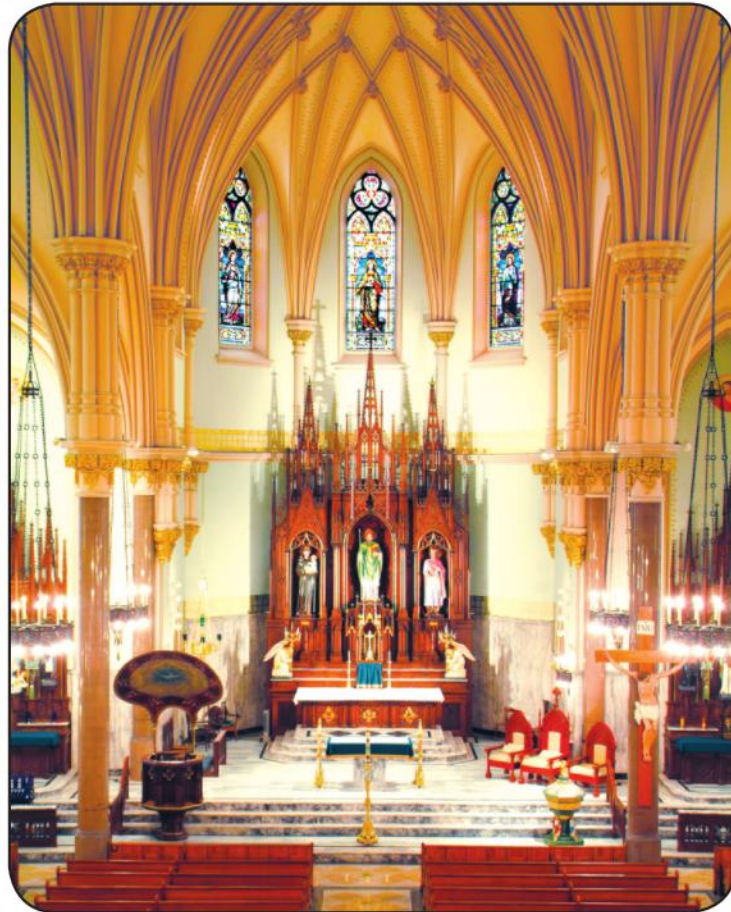

Dear People of God,

Pope Francis recently issued an encyclical letter, "Brothers and Sisters all." It didn't get much play in the American press, but it's a wonderful discussion of the common relationship between all men and women created in the image and likeness of God. Yes, we have clear differences: (1) we look different, the result of millennia living under different environmental conditions; (2) we speak a variety of languages, explained in Genesis as the result of human arrogance and by ethnicians as the result of humanity finding itself in different environments separated from others so that language developed unique "local" flavors; (3) we have diverse cultural heritages depending on where we live or came from. Nevertheless, in the end, people are people and we all have common historical links. You may recall my mentioning from the pulpit that science eventually catches up to the Bible; for example, some German specialists examining mitochondrial DNA have pinned down that one common human mother had five daughters and we're all related to that one common mother whom we call Eve. That relationship, writes Francis, should lead all of us to consider the larger sense of family and then lead us to stop doing some of the things we do to create enmity, rancor, division and ethnic hatreds that take the lives of thousands every year. The pope would certainly laud the development of peace agreements between the Jews and their Islamic neighbors given that the Bible tells us they are all descendants of Abraham, family if you will. (You can look this up on the FORMED platform by reviewing the wealth of information in the Book of Genesis.)

Tragically, many of the so-called "ethnic" divisions we read about all too often are the result of religion. Faith should lead us to the Great Command, one that is not unique to the Judeo-Christian peoples: love of the divine as our creator and sustainer and then love of God's creation, especially of other people who are part of our larger family. Yes, we should take our faith seriously; after all, it's a gift from God. However, we ought not to discount the capacity of a loving God to interrelate with other people in a way that reflects the cultural milieu in which those people live and work. Yes, we ought to be proud of our faith and live it out in a way that is inviting and hospitable so that our way of life attracts others to it, but we should never attempt to force others to follow our faith any more than we expect others to force us to follow theirs. Genuine evangelization, sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ, happens best when we actually live our faith and reveal our love for God and neighbor. You can find Francis' encyclical letter by looking up "fratelli tutti" on the web. That'll take you to the Vatican and a few other sites which have English translations of the Italian document. It is a timely reminder of the ties that enlarge our sense of who is "family" and may inspire a kinder, more loving relationship with diverse groups of God's people.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Liturgical Ministers during COVID-19

Lector – We still need proclaimers of the Word at both the 8 a.m. Mass and 10 a.m. Mass on Sunday mornings. We will happily train anyone interested in serving as lectors who have not read at Mass before.

What to know:

Lectors must be age 65 or younger to be on the altar, or willing to sign a waiver

Lectors may read both readings and the stanzas of the psalm

If there are two lectors for Mass, there will be six feet of separation between the seats for proper social distancing

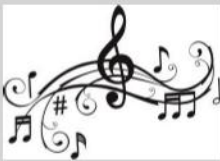
Lectors will receive Holy Communion on the altar
