Dear People of God,

Between 1.2 million and 2.5 million tons of plastic generated in the United States were dropped on land, rivers, lakes and oceans as litter, were illegally dumped or shipped aboard, then not properly disposed of. (Toledo Blade, 31 October 2020, Sec A, p 8) This startling fact may inspire us to to wonder about the consequences and to think about our role in caring for our environment. It also invites us to examine our response to a variety of challenges that occur within our environment, especially the current challenge of the pandemic.

I see that the story is going around that the Covid-19 pandemic is a visitation on us by a vengeful God punishing us for our numerous transgressions. While I would agree that there are numerous transgressions of the Great Command to love God and neighbor, to say nothing of appropriately loving ourselves, I would merely say that the idea that God sent the virus as a punishment is pure rubbish. The God of love would never send a plague as punishment or for any other reason. Plagues occur for a variety of reasons, many of them the arrogance of humans who fiddle with nature and bring about huge disasters when the fiddling gets out of hand. Others are the result of nature doing her thing, constantly evolving and changing and coming up with new germs, bacteria, and viruses, just because that's what nature does. The things thrown at us by nature are what the Church refers to as "ontic evil," the evil that resides in the processes of creation. Hurricanes, volcanoes, tidal waves, droughts, tornadoes, lighteningstruck forest fires, avalanches and other ordinary things happen because we live in a world that is moving, changing, growing and dying; these natural occurrences have always been part of existence, but as we increase in numbers (compare what might have bothered Adam and Eve to what might bother modern-day India with a billion people on the sub-continent), those natural processes tend to pose ever-greater problems.

We human beings are the top of the heap when it comes to intelligence so one would expect that we face these natural, or man-made dilemmas with some intelligence and deal with them in ways that minimize the cost in lives and property. Unfortunately, human arrogance is often stronger in us than is our intelligence so we don't bother to face up to the threats and then we cry crocodile tears when the disaster strikes.

By way of an example, take climate change. Whether caused by us or by the ordinary processes of nature (climate change is nothing new on earth – it's destroyed any number of otherwise thriving cultures), what are we doing to actually deal with it? We understand that a warming world means high levels of the sea, but are we doing anything to reduce the number of people dwelling along the shore, or move people out of the big cities along the coasts rather than into them? We can probably not change climate change, but we're supposed to be smart enough to deal with it rather than tilt at windmills and wind up being victimized by it.

How about the plastic "island" in the pacific? What are we doing to prevent it? Do we try to minimize our use of plastic? Do we resolve to never toss plastic out where it can get into moving water and find its way into the oceans (1.5 million tons of plastic is 3,000,000,000 pounds of plastic)? Some people are doing their best to protect the environment but apparently others in great numbers are not or that island wouldn't be out there!

Obviously there are elements of our environment and processes in nature that are beyond our control. That, however, does not mean abandoning efforts to adapt or to attempt remedies for man-made problems. Let's all do our best to make the whole planet a better place to live by attending to the quality of that part in which we find ourselves.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

We will not have a choir, there will be no acolytes and no hospitality after Mass. There are still ways to answer God's call to ministry, though. Please consider trying a new role at Mass. Once we have the names of the people willing to participate, a new schedule will be created and mailed. Look forward to seeing you! Msgr. Chris Liturgical Ministers during COVID-19 Lector - We still need proclaimers of the Word at both the 8 a.m. Mass and 10 a.m. Mass on Sunday mornings. We will happily train anyone interested in serving as lectors who have not read at Mass before. What to know: Lectors must be age 65 or younger to be on the altar, or willing to sign a waiver Lectors may read both readings and the stanzas of the psalm If there are two lectors for Mass, there will be six feet of separation between the seats for proper social distancing Lectors will receive Holy Communion on the altar Ushers - We need ushers to help dismiss parishioners at the end of Mass to receive Holy Communion before exiting the church. We will provide training for anyone new to the role of usher at HSP. What to know: All ushers must wear masks How to sign up - Call Sherri in the Parish Office at 419.243.6452, or talk to Pat Thompson, Mary Kay McPartlin or Martha Farrell after Mass
