

Dear People of God,

The Advent Season has come of late to be considered a period of penitential introspection, self-denial and other ways and means of doing penance. It's supposed to be a time of watchful waiting but waiting in joyful expectation for what has been promised from the very beginning, a savior. How can that be anything but a period of excitement, song, festivity, and perhaps even partying? True, we should be careful not to begin the partying appropriate to Christmas until Christmas, but we should not make Advent a four week version of Lent.

How we make note of the prophetic history leading up to the birth of Christ at the other end of Advent can help us shape those four weeks into the period of happiness and joy they should be. You might begin by looking up the resources about Advent available on the FORMED platform. You might want to set aside one evening each week of Advent to watch one of the many films available touching on the Patriarchs or the prophets who provide the words of promise that the time of salvation is at hand. A family gathering for one of those movies, complete with buttery popcorn and cold pop, would certainly be a festive moment to celebrate our faith and our family. At the sometime, such a choice avoids rushing too quickly into Rudolph and the Grinch!

I recently saw an Advent Calendar of various different beers at one of the big box stores. I'm not sure that's the idea behind the Advent calendar, but it certainly points to the festivity with which the season should be celebrated. Perhaps following the Church's calendar might help us keep the meaning of Advent as a period of watchful waiting and make us aware of the sacrifices of those who did the waiting. There are over two hundred saints whose feasts are commemorated on the days leading up to Christmas so there's far more than Saint Nick and Saint Lucy to keep our attention on a life of holiness. Several sites on the web will introduce you to these amazing people.

Take time to really make Advent meaningful by celebrating it as more than a period of days set aside to shop for Christmas. Use those days, or part of them when you're not rushing around buying all the Christmas gifts to give thought to what it was the people of the Bible were waiting for and then give thanks that you live in a time when you know the Christ that the people were waiting for and you are using these weeks to renew your loving welcome for him.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

<u>Matrimony</u>: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

With the changes required by the Diocese of Toledo, the role of Liturgical Ministers will be different at our Masses for a while. Eucharistic Ministers will **not** be utilized as Communion will only be the Body of Christ and distributed by the priest and deacon. We will not have a choir, there will be no acolvtes and no hospitality after Mass.

There are still ways to answer God's call to ministry, though. Please consider trying a new role at Mass. Once we have the names of the people willing to participate, a new schedule will be created and mailed.

Liturgical Ministers during COVID-19

Lector – We still need proclaimers of the Word at both the 8 a.m. Mass and 10 a.m. Mass on Sunday mornings. We will happily train anyone interested in serving as lectors who have not read at Mass before.

What to know:

Lectors must be age 65 or younger to be on the altar, or willing to sign a waiver

Lectors may read both readings and the stanzas of the psalm

If there are two lectors for Mass, there will be six feet of separation between the seats for proper social distancing

Lectors will receive Holy Communion on the altar

Ushers – We need ushers to help dismiss parishioners at the end of Mass to receive Holy Communion before exiting the church. We will provide training for anyone new to the role of usher at HSP.

What to know:

All ushers must wear masks


