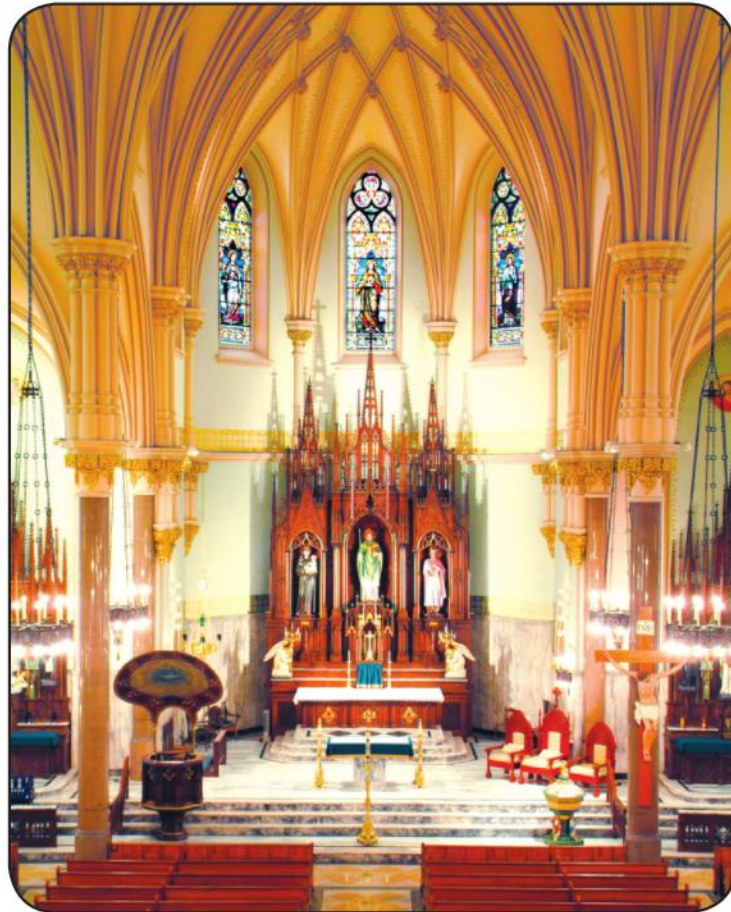

Dear People of God,

It always seems that the Christmas Season is over before it's properly begun, at least in the Church where it doesn't really start until the 25th of December. There are several major holy days during the season, including the Solemnity of the Epiphany or the visitation of the three wise ones. Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar were more than likely astrologers whose night studies led them to discover a star, a beaming source of light which led them to find Mary, Joseph and the child Jesus. They intuited that the star indicated the birth of a king; as they arrive at the scene of the Holy Family, they acknowledge straight away that this king is also divine which is why we hear that they prostrated themselves in worship of the child. We, too, kneel during the Mass as a sign of our recognizing in Jesus both king and God.

Legend suggests that the three wise ones were an Egyptian, a Persian and an Ethiopian, the three great empires which were so well known for their ongoing studies of the night skies; here in America those same night skies intrigued the Meso-American cultures and led to the construction of complicated pyramids and sentinels for keeping track of what the heavens were up to.

Today we are no less interested in the night skies. The media rang with praise of the Japanese recovery of asteroid materials and more of the moon; furthermore, modern astronomy is ever attempting to better understand the mysteries of the universe laid out in its splendor above our earth.

For Christians the skies still provide the same message that was revealed to the three wise ones: There is God and God is pretty good at what he can do. We are humbled by the expanse and complexity of the stars, galaxies and even by black holes, wondering at the power of the creator who designed it all (by the way, you can find design mentioned in the Bible; look at the readings for the third week of Advent). The mysteries of the night sky are among equally fascinating creations on earth which inspire some pretty interesting questions about God and faith, questions which I hope you are all bringing to the SEARCH sessions being offered all across the diocese and right here in the parish. It's not too late to get on board with this exciting program. It may be the perfect catalyst for new insights into your own relationship with God.

### ***The Celebration of Sacraments***

**Infant Baptism:** The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults:** RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

**Penance:** The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony:** Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick:** When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

We will not have a choir, there will be no acolytes and no hospitality after Mass.

There are still ways to answer God's call to ministry, though. Please consider trying a new role at Mass. Once we have the names of the people willing to participate, a new schedule will be created and mailed.

**Liturgical Ministers during COVID-19**

**Lector** – We still need proclaimers of the Word at both the 8 a.m. Mass and 10 a.m. Mass on Sunday mornings. We will happily train anyone interested in serving as lectors who have not read at Mass before.

**What to know:**

Lectors must be age 65 or younger to be on the altar, or willing to sign a waiver

Lectors may read both readings and the stanzas of the psalm

If there are two lectors for Mass, there will be six feet of separation between the seats for proper social distancing

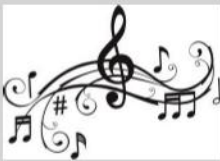
Lectors will receive Holy Communion on the altar

## Happenings at the Parish!

### Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a *Level 3 Snow Emergency*

during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion. When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan, parish, or school events in that geographic region are also cancelled.

**Q. What does the word Epiphany mean?**

**A. Manifestation**

What the church celebrates today is the **manifestation** of our Lord to the whole world; after being made known to the shepherds of Bethlehem He is revealed to the Magi who have come from the East to adore Him. Christian tradition has seen in the Magi the first fruits of the Gentiles; they lead in their wake all the peoples of the earth, and thus the Epiphany is an affirmation of the universal salvation.

### Health News from the Parish Nurse for January 3, 2021

**Facts about COVID-19 Vaccines: COVID-19 vaccines will not give you COVID-19.** None of the COVID-19 vaccines currently in development in the United States use the live virus that causes COVID-19. There are several different types of vaccines in development. However, the goal for each of them is to teach our immune systems how to recognize and fight the virus that causes COVID-19. Sometimes this process can cause symptoms, such as fever. These symptoms are normal and are a sign that the body is building immunity. It typically takes a few weeks for the body to build immunity after vaccination. That means it's possible a person could be infected with the virus that causes COVID-19 just before or just after vaccination and get sick. This is because the vaccine has not had enough time to provide protection.
