

Dear People of God,

The tragedy unfolding before us in the political arena is truly saddening. The results of the recent special election In Georgia underscore the division currently gripping our nation: 50-50. The lack of conversation between opposing ideologies has even led to vilification within the parish. How sad. Certainly we don't all agree on things in the Church or in the political arena, but when those disagreements begin to rouse ad hominem attacks, it is sign of a grave wound in the Mystical Body of Christ of which we form a part.

Some years ago the Catholic world, at least here in the United States, was scandalized by the research of Fr. Andrew Greeley who concluded that two-thirds of those attending Mass do not believe in the real presence of Jesus Christ in the Sacrament of the Eucharist. That's a foundational belief of the Catholic Church: Jesus makes himself available in the Eucharist so that each one of us can participate in the divine and be perfected over time to reform ourselves and the world in which we live. Absolutely nothing should intrude to deter any of us who believe in the real presence from being part of the Body of Christ gathered together to celebrate the Christ present to us. So where is everybody?

Sadly, I suspect many of those who profess to be Catholic are distanced from the real presence and see what we do at Mass as a performance without any necessity to be there. I would urge all of us to undertake a serious time of self reflection, using the ample resources available on the FORMED platform, to discover the rich theology of the early Church, the wealth of insight of the Second Vatican Council touching on the Eucharist, the blessings connected to its celebration and reception, and the real presence encountered. Such a reflection might reveal some wounds in our own lives which call for healing at the font of life which is Jesus present to us in the Sacramental Life of the Church.

Many believe that this Wednesday our nation will face the greatest challenge to its stability in over a century and a half. Not since the Civil War have we seen what has transpired in the capitol recently. As Catholics we have been told by Jesus to render unto Caesar what is Caesar's. . . and that means as citizens of the United States we owe allegiance to the Constitution. That document provides a methodology for the peaceful transition of power from one administration to another, a transition which should be respected and supported by those who voted for the winners and those who did not, allowing our elected representatives to strive together for the good of all. Let us commit ourselves this week to prayer and action in support of the Constitution and of one nation under God, with liberty and justice for all.

#### **The Celebration of Sacraments**

**Infant Baptism**: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>**: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

**Penance**: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony**: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick**: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

#### **Liturgical Ministry Update** With the changes required by the Diocese of Toledo, the role of Liturgical Ministers will be different at our Masses for a while. Eucharistic Ministers will not be utilized as Communion will only be the Body of Christ and distributed by the priest and deacon. We will not have a choir, there will be no acolytes and no hospitality after Mass. There are still ways to answer God's call to ministry, though. Please consider trying a new role at Mass. Once we have the names of the people willing to participate, a new schedule will be created and mailed. Look forward to seeing you! Msgr. Chris Liturgical Ministers during COVID-19 Lector - We still need proclaimers of the Word at both the 8 a.m. Mass and 10 a.m. Mass on Sunday mornings. We will happily train anyone interested in serving as lectors who have not read at Mass before. What to know: Lectors must be age 65 or younger to be on the altar, or willing to sign a waiver Lectors may read both readings and the stanzas of the psalm If there are two lectors for Mass, there will be six feet of separation between the seats for proper social distancing Lectors will receive Holy Communion on the altar Ushers - We need ushers to help dismiss parishioners at the end of Mass to receive Holy Communion before exiting the church. We will provide training for anyone new to the role of usher at HSP. What to know: All ushers must wear masks How to sign up - Call Sherri in the Parish Office at 419.243.6452, or talk to Pat Thompson, Mary Kay McPartlin or Martha Farrell after Mass

## Happenings at the Parish!

Whenever a County/City within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a *Level 3 Snow Emergency* 

during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion. When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan, parish, or

school events in that geographic region are also cancelled.

## Health News from the Parish Nurse for January 17, 2021

Facts about COVID-19 Vaccines: People who have gotten sick with COVID-19 may still benefit from getting vaccinated.

Due to the severe health risks associated with COVID-19 and the fact that re-infection with COVID-19 is possible, people may be advised to get a COVID-19 vaccine even if they have been sick with COVID-19 before. At this time, experts do not know how long someone is protected from getting sick again after recovering from COVID-19. The immunity someone gains from having an infection, called natural immunity, varies from person to person. Some early evidence suggests natural immunity may not last very long.

We won't know how long immunity produced by vaccination lasts until we have a vaccine and more data on how well it works. Both natural immunity and vaccine-induced immunity are important aspects of COVID-19 that experts are trying to learn more about, and CDC will keep the public informed as new evidence becomes available.
