

Dear People of God,

I believe the time for the faithful to stand up and be counted has arrived. My thanks to those who have faithfully been coming together to celebrate Christ's presence to us in the Eucharist. Their attendance is testimony to their belief that being at mass is worth the low risk involved. Now the time has come for those "following" us on streaming and Facebook to reconsider this choice. It's time to come home and return to the community of faith, the community of life and love. Yes, staying home was intended to avoid risking our lives by gathering to give true worship to God and receive in exchange the very presence of the divine. Early in the pandemic, this was understandable, a fact verified by alternate acceptable methods of "attending" mass. However, masks, social distancing, and modifications to other church procedures have changed the landscape. We have even added an 8 a.m. mass to accommodate those feeling particularly vulnerable; the capacity of our spacious church and the minimal attendance (30 or so appears to be a reasonable estimate) makes this option as close to no-risk as possible. Feedback from attendees has been positive. As things stand now, apparently we're willing to risk our lives to go into the grocery for milk to lighten the coffee we're enjoying while in our pajamas sitting at home streaming Mass but aren't quite so open to being infected by attending the life-giving Eucharist. Apparently we're more than willing to risk our lives to get to a big "members only" store to hoard toilet paper but can't bring ourselves to risk the crowd and potential infection at Sunday Liturgy. Apparently we're more than willing to lay our lives on the line to head to a restaurant for a good meal but can find an easy excuse to avoid the sacred meal provided by Jesus.

As your pastor I have taken those same risks. I go grocery shopping, stop in at a "members only" store to find the toilet paper aisle empty. and have enjoyed dining at many of our beleaguered local restaurants. I have not made the excuse that I am risking my life by conducting Mass, which, given the suspension of the on-site attendance obligation, I suspect I could do, citing my age and several of my indicators for a higher risk of death from the coronavirus. Let's get honest for a minute. Death is real and there is a risk of dying every day from illness, accident or from someone who has it in for us. The risk at church is minimal given the protections we provide; furthermore, as I recall, should we contract the virus at church, dying for our faith is considered exemplary and would lead to sainthood far faster than being infected at any store or restaurant and subsequently dying from this disease. Your St. Patrick's family is anxious to welcome you back to worship in this beautiful setting. Let's quit making excuses and come home to the community of life, love and redemption.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

We will not have a choir, there will be no acolytes and no hospitality after Mass.

There are still ways to answer God's call to ministry, though. Please consider trying a new role at Mass. Once we have the names of the people willing to participate, a new schedule will be created and mailed.

Liturgical Ministers during COVID-19

Lector – We still need proclaimers of the Word at both the 8 a.m. Mass and 10 a.m. Mass on Sunday mornings. We will happily train anyone interested in serving as lectors who have not read at Mass before.

What to know:

Lectors must be age 65 or younger to be on the altar, or willing to sign a waiver

Lectors may read both readings and the stanzas of the psalm

If there are two lectors for Mass, there will be six feet of separation between the seats for proper social distancing

Lectors will receive Holy Communion on the altar

Ushers – We need ushers to help dismiss parishioners at the end of Mass to receive Holy Communion before exiting the church. We will provide training for anyone new to the role of usher at HSP.

What to know:

All ushers must wear masks

Happenings at the Parish!

Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a *Level 3 Snow Emergency*

during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion. When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan, parish, or school events in that geographic region are also cancelled.



Log on to the Toledo Lucas County Health Dept. website at: www.lucascountyhealth.com. Click on the vaccine image to get started. Then click on "Vaccination Notification Sign-Up for Individuals." Complete the sign-up form to be notified when you are able to schedule your vaccination appointment. Please double check your contact information as it is vitally important to ensure you can be reached when ready. If you need help registering, please call 2-1-1 Monday-Friday 8am-7pm & Saturday & Sunday 8am-5pm or the Area Office on Aging at 419-382-0624 (for individuals 65+). The next anticipated Phase is 1B starting on January 25th: (people age 65 and older; people living with severe congenital, developmental, or early-onset medical conditions; adults who work in schools (K-12) and unvaccinated Phase 1A individuals. Once Lucas County begins your vaccination phase you will be notified how to schedule your vaccination at one of the many 20+ sites available in Lucas County.

January 25--Feast Day of the Conversion of St. Paul the Apostle

St. Paul, named Saul at his circumcision, a Jew of the tribe of Benjamin, was born at Tarsus, the capitol of Cilicia. He was a Roman citizen. He was brought up as a strict Jew, and later became a violent persecutor of the Christians. While on his way to Damascus to make new arrests of Christians, he was suddenly converted by a miraculous apparition of Our Lord. From a fierce persecutor he became the great Apostle of the Gentiles. He made three missionary journeys which brought him to the great centers of Asia Minor and southern Europe, and made many converts. Fourteen of his Epistles are found in the New Testament. He was beheaded in Rome around 66 A.D., and his relics are in the Basilica of St. Paul Outside-the-Walls near the Ostian Way.
