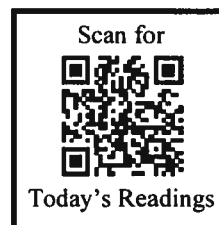

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Gospel Reading Homily

Profession of Faith (Niceno-Constantinopolitan Creed)

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. 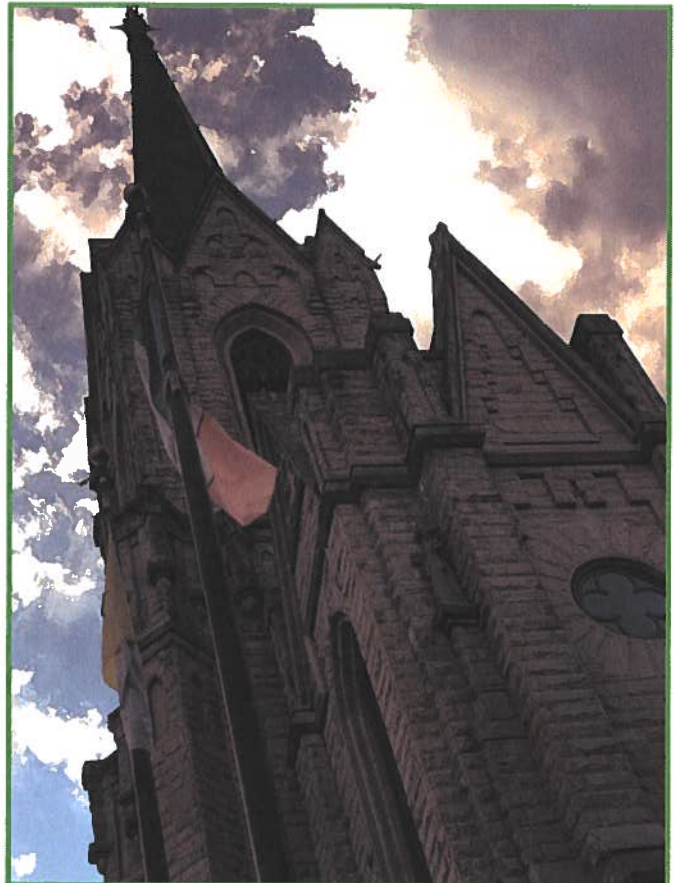
As parishioners we are caretakers for the history of the parish. To preserve the beauty and gifts of our church, we need to open wide our doors and invite people to share our blessings.

The more we can connect with people beyond on parish, the more likely **The Historic Church of Saint Patrick** will be standing on Avondale for the Catholic faith forever.

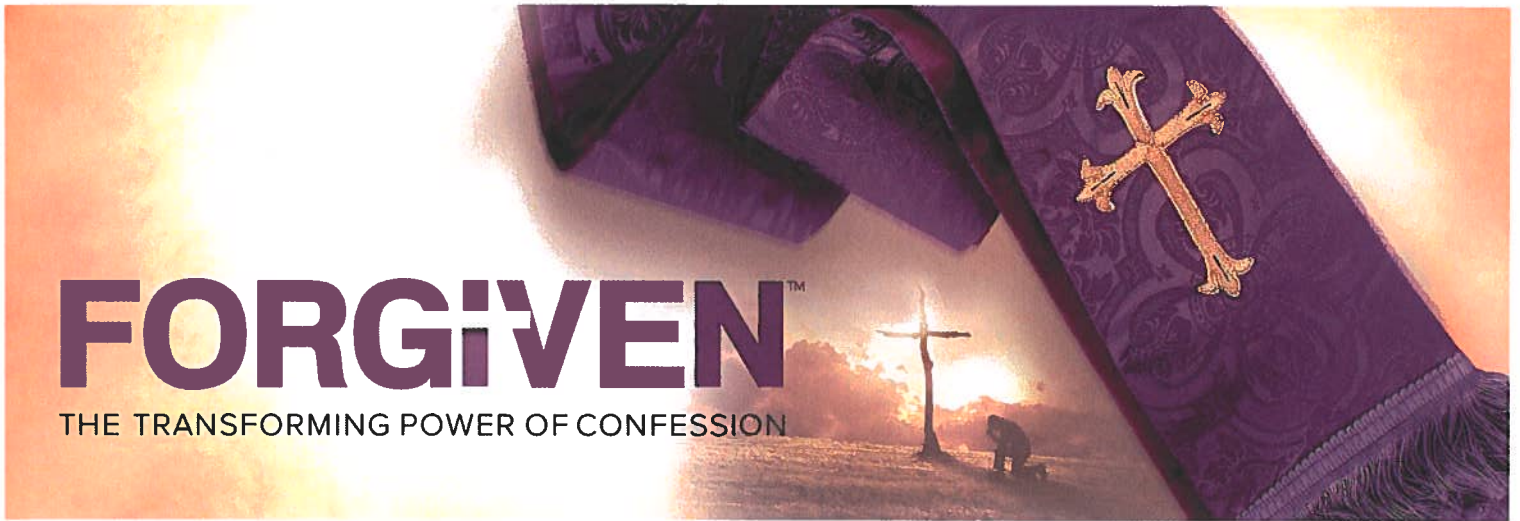

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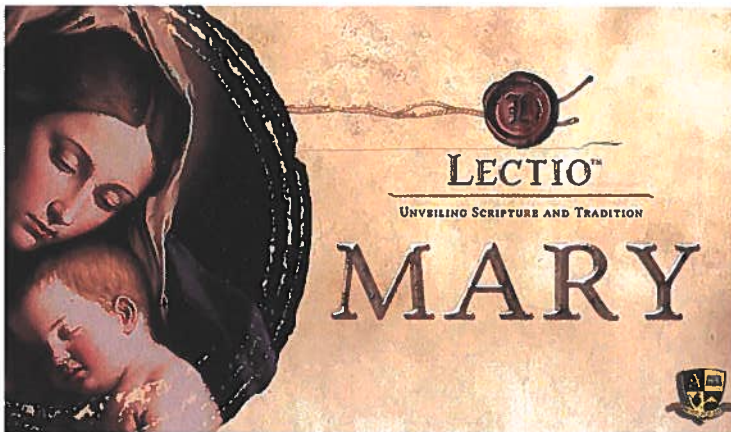

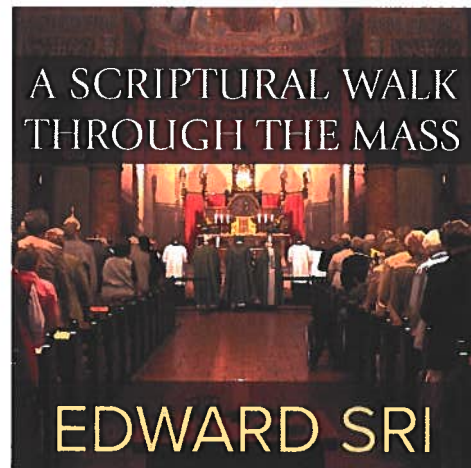
