

Gospel Reading Homily

Profession of Faith (Niceno-Constantinopolitan Creed)

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. The more we can connect with people beyond on parish, the more likely The Historic Church of Saint Patrick will be standing on Avondale for the Catholic faith forever.






