

Dear People of God,

I recently had a conversation with a parishioner who commented that there are still some who believe that unless you become Catholic, you can't be saved. Of course, the parishioner didn't believe that and neither does the Church. In fact, you can't come to Mass and not hear the Church praying just the opposite!

At the end of the Eucharistic Prayers (there are ten and all of them end much the same), the Universal Church prays for the dead. Here's an example from Eucharistic Prayer II:

> Remember also our brothers and sisters who have fallen asleep in the hope of the Resurrection, and all who have died in your mercy, welcome them into the light of your face.

Those who have fallen asleep in the hope of the Resurrection isn't limited to Catholics, but includes everyone who believes in Jesus and the Good News of salvation. All who have died in your mercy goes well beyond Christianity and would include people of faith of every stripe. The prayer is to allow God to do God's will and his will is the salvation of souls by whatever means God has to accomplish that end.

On the other hand, if God reveals the fullness of truth to any of us in the Catholic faith, then we should continue to be Catholic and do what Catholics do: adhere to the Profession of Faith, live out the Mission of Baptism to proclaim the Good News, give full faith to and believe in the Teaching magisterium, embrace the Precepts of the Church and powerfully witness to the Great Command to love God, ourselves and our neighbors whether they're Catholic or not. This means, as Benedict wrote most recently, *once a Catholic, always a Catholic*. You can't leave the Church; you may seem to do so but your heart never does.

I often hear from disgruntled Catholics (did you ever meet a gruntled Catholic?) that well, I was baptized by my parents before I had a chance to make a choice of my own. Parents love their children and wish for them the gift of salvation, a gift that offers the baptized the true presence of Jesus Christ to walk life in partnership. That's a pretty great gift to be throwing away because it wasn't your choice. Our personal choice comes into play at Confirmation when we stand before the Bishop and choose to be an active Catholic, not just one who stands off to the side and lets others do God's important work. I would suggest that people who complain about the Church or being Catholic aren't active and never were; if they were content to be Catholic and especially if they were active, they'd find ample reason to say thanks to whoever brought them to the faith.

#### The Celebration of Sacraments

**Infant Baptism**: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>**: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

**Penance**: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony**: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick**: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

#### Liturgical Ministry Update With the changes required by the Diocese of Toledo, the role of Liturgical Ministers will be different at our Masses for a while. Eucharistic Ministers will not be utilized as Communion will only be the Body of Christ and distributed by the priest and deacon. We will not have a choir, there will be no acolytes and no hospitality after Mass. There are still ways to answer God's call to ministry, though. Please consider trying a new role at Mass. Once we have the names of the people willing to participate, a new schedule will be created and mailed. Look forward to seeing you! Msar. Chris Liturgical Ministers during COVID-19 Lector - We still need proclaimers of the Word at both the 8 a.m. Mass and 10 a.m. Mass on Sunday mornings. We will happily train anyone interested in serving as lectors who have not read at Mass before. What to know: Lectors must be age 65 or younger to be on the altar, or willing to sign a waiver Lectors may read both readings and the stanzas of the psalm If there are two lectors for Mass, there will be six feet of separation between the seats for proper social distancing Lectors will receive Holy Communion on the altar Ushers - We need ushers to help dismiss parishioners at the end of Mass to receive Holy Communion before exiting the church. We will provide training for anyone new to the role of usher at HSP. 
