

Dear People of God,

We're well into the Year of St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Over the centuries Joseph has received very little acclaim beyond being the patron of a happy death. I hope everyone has taken advantage of this year dedicated to Joseph to read the document written by Pope Francis declaring the special twelve-month celebration. I also want to dispel a few myths which circulate about Joseph.

The biggest myth is that he was a gray-haired bachelor at death's door when he was selected to be the foster-father of Jesus. This story, which has no historical evidence at all, came about because after the nativity stories, we never hear about Joseph again; many presumed that was because he must have died long before the public ministry and that meant he must have been an old man when he and Mary entered matrimony.

More than likely, Joseph was about the same age as Mary; that was the customary way people married in Hebrew society in the era of Jesus. Life spans were not as long as they are today so adulthood arrived much sooner and boys were engaged (betrothed is the word we read in the gospels) around the age of twelve or thirteen. The custom was to arrange a marriage with a cousin or some other relative so both Joseph and Mary would have shared descent from David. Thus, the genealogy provided in the gospel of Matthew, which ends with Joseph, would have been very similar to that of Mary up to the time of the grandparents of either. Since betrothal lasted about a year, Joseph and Mary would have been around fourteen when they married.

Many believe that Joseph, a carpenter, would have been at the bottom of the socio-economic ladder. Another myth. Keep in mind that carpentry is an essential element of a culture so carpenters are often at the top of the scale, not the bottom. Because tools, transportation, roofing, furniture and even dishes and cups were all made of wood, the person who could work wood was always in high demand. Given the climate of the Holy Land, lumber was at a premium, causing prices for wood objects to have been relatively high. Nevertheless, Joseph would not have been considered wealthy. Nazareth, like most Hebrew villages, would have included around fifty households; such a limited market wasn't one which would provide unlimited income, but Joseph would have been able to provide a comfortable environment in which Jesus would have grown up. We can also presume that being at the upper end of the culture, Joseph could read and write, talents which were quite rare in his era. More than likely, as I would hope parents are doing today, he taught Jesus to read and to write. Although we know relatively little about Joseph, we do know that God chose him to be Mary's husband and Jesus' foster-father; that alone allows us to draw favorable conclusions about this good man and his role in his family.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

<u>Matrimony</u>: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Liturgical Ministers during COVID-19

Lector – We still need proclaimers of the Word at both the 8 a.m. Mass and 10 a.m. Mass on Sunday mornings. We will happily train anyone interested in serving as lectors who have not read at Mass before.

What to know:

Lectors must be age 65 or younger to be on the altar, or willing to sign a waiver

Lectors may read both readings and the stanzas of the psalm

If there are two lectors for Mass, there will be six feet of separation between the seats for proper social distancing

Lectors will receive Holy Communion on the altar

Ushers – We need ushers to help dismiss parishioners at the end of Mass to receive Holy Communion before exiting the church. We will provide training for anyone new to the role of usher at HSP.

Health News from the Parish Nurse for May 9, 2021

Tips for a Healthy Spring: Rethink your diet. "It's important to make sure you're getting a balance of nutrients. Keep your food choices simple in the midst of conflicting nutritional and weight-loss messages," Dr. Dickens-Celestin says. "Most nutrition experts agree that choosing whole, unprocessed foods, and reducing added sugars and portion sizes will improve your nutrition," Dr. Dickens-Celestin adds. To reduce sugars, scan ingredients on packaged foods and choose those with little or no sweeteners, including corn syrup, evaporated cane sugar, dextrose and fructose. Bolster your meals and snacks with more raw foods, such as raw nuts, baby carrots, broccoli and zucchini. An easy way to make sure you are loading up on fiber, vitamins and other nutrients is to enjoy spring's bounty of colorful fruits and vegetables. Include three or more colors in each meal, and one or two in snacks. Try scrambling eggs with spinach and red bell peppers; add raspberries and oranges to green salads, or add blackberries or blueberries to yogurt. If your family enjoys take-out, try fakeaways instead - healthy homemade meals intended to replicate takeaway food, such as gourmet pizza, sizzling stir fry and Chinese noodles.
