

Dear People of God,

I had an interesting conversation with someone of another ecclesial community (Church) who told me he accepted Jesus Christ as his personal Lord and savior at baptism. The Catechism of The Catholic Church reminds us that faith, one's conversion to Jesus as a savior, occurs before baptism and leads us to an ecclesial community or Church where baptism provides the external sign and symbol of our becoming part of that Church. For Catholics we believe that baptism joins us to the universal Body of Christ; thus, while baptism generally marks us as Catholics, we don't need to ever re-baptize those baptized *in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirt* in any other ecclesial community since our faith tells us that baptism is once for all.


As a sign of membership, baptism obliges us to become a genuine, active part of the community in which we have been baptized. Recall the words of Jesus to the Disciples as he prepared to ascend to the Father: *go, teach all nations, baptizing them.*.. Given the genuine, active role of membership conferred by baptism means we should always and ever be disciples, a word which means "student of an admitted Master."

Students **learn** and that's the real emphasis we ought to be putting on our baptism. We should learn everything we can about God, Jesus, salvation, Sacraments, the hierarchical structures of our Church and its Mission and Ministry. We should then become **active and involved** in what our Church does, from being part of the praying community on a regular basis to volunteering for any of its many ministries. That involvement is the way we take up the same work of teaching which Jesus gave to the disciples and all those who follow in their footsteps. The most important aspect of the teaching we do in accord with the Gospels is to invite others to come along with us on the journey of faith in the Catholic community. Making good use of FORMED can give all of us some great ideas on how to do that all-important inviting.

Why not take up the challenge of discipleship and over the next months before October (when RCIA begins in earnest), ask ten people, especially a few younger ones, to give serious thought to becoming a Catholic? Fifty positive responses would certainly be a great blessing not only for the for the parish but also for your exercise of your baptismal membership and your confirmation commitment.

Since I recently wrote about using the FORMED platform, here are two opportunities for nurturing your faith which are relevant to today's bulletin letter. You can read the essential teachings of the Catholic Church in the Catechism of the Catholic Church beginning at §1213 with a brief summary at §§1275-1284. Or you can have all of this explained in a video or audio presentation by going to the FORMED platform: look up the sacrament of baptism and find a wealth of material to choose from.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.





Health News from the Parish Nurse for June 6, 2021

Checklist for Blood Clot Risk Factors. If you think you might be too young or too physically fit to experience a blood clot, think again. Blood clots do not discriminate. They affect people of all ages, race & gender. Some of the most common risk factors for blood clots include:

- Hospitalization for illness or surgery
- Major surgery, particularly of the pelvis, abdomen, hip, knee
- Severe physical trauma, such as a car accident
- Injury to a vein that may have been caused by a broken bone or severe muscle injury
- Hip or knee replacement surgery
- Cancer and cancer treatments
- Use of birth control methods that contain estrogen, such as the pill, patch or ring
- Pregnancy and up to 3 months after the baby is born
- The use of hormone therapy with estrogen
- Personal or family history of blood clots
- Overweight
- Confinement to bed or a wheelchair
- Sitting too long, especially with legs crossed
- Smoking
- Age 55 or older
- Long-term diseases such as heart and lung conditions, or diabetes
