

Dear People of God,

With the return to normal, such as it is, I was asked why the bishops of Ohio (and everywhere else) suspended the obligation to be at Mass every Sunday if it's such an important function of being Catholic. Indeed, weekly attendance is among the check-list items which are minimally required to be able to claim one is a Catholic. Each baptized person, man and woman, young and old, should consider it a vital sign of community and a thankful return to God for the manifold gifts we have received. So, why did the bishops suspend the requirement?

The Church doesn't exist to punish people so the precepts (those minimal behaviors we're supposed to follow - see FORMED for insight into these behaviors) are what is called ecclesiological law, that is, something the Church itself defines so can also change. As the principal lawgiver/enforcer in the diocese, the bishop can change those laws for the good of his people. A pandemic certainly seems a time to think of the good health of the people in the diocese and take action to ease the requirements. However, given the importance of this particular law about weekly attendance of the community giving community worship and adoration to God, a single bishop is hesitant to act without consulting his neighbors. A bishop's neighbors generally are the bishops of the Province (usually a civil governmental unit such as Ohio or Michigan). If the bishops agree that the law ought to be relaxed in their own dioceses, then they would tend to act together, issuing a statement to which each affixes his signature to show agreement and precisely what law is being eased.

Although the bishops temporarily waived physical attendance at mass, they supported and encouraged "attendance" via other formats: thus Catholics were able to be at mass via internet streaming, Facebook, and TV broadcasts. Here at St.Pat's, we streamed on Facebook and YouTube to enable our parish family to attend mass.

Ohio's bishops, following the advice and guidance of the Ohio Department of Health, deemed it wise and prudent to excuse people from Mass while the worst of the pandemic was threatening the good health of Catholic men and women. That decision wasn't taken lightly. In the past, outbreaks of serious illness were not seen as calling for such a suspension. Those who got the sickness were certainly excused: the sick are not bound by the rule and shouldn't be at Mass anyway to prevent spreading the illness. The Coronavirus pandemic was spread by aerosols so a sneeze, a cough, hiccup, even speaking excitedly could send the virus into the atmosphere and infect people as far as twelve feet away. Because the Mass is often crowded with people much closer than that, the bishops, guided by the Health department, decided it was far better to stay home and pray than join the community and risk the virus. As of the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, the requirement is back in place and it is the expectation of the Church that all Catholics who want to be considered Catholic will be at Mass every Sunday. See you there!

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.



Health News from the Parish Nurse for June 27, 2021 Other steps you can take to reduce prevent blood clots:

• It's important to know your family history. Tell your doctor and other family members if you learn that there is a history of blood clots among your relatives.

• If you have to be confined to a bed in a hospital or at home following surgery or due to illness or paralysis, ask your doctor what options exist to prevent blood clots.

• Get up and move if you've been sitting for a long time or traveling for a long time by plane, train, or car. Stand up, walk around, and stretch your legs every two to three hours.

- Maintain a healthy weight.
- Don't smoke or take steps to quit smoking.
