

Dear People of God,

A few weeks ago the Diocese launched a program titled Intentional Planning, part of the overall Diocesan effort to assist parishes in refreshing their spiritual life and ministry. The goal of this program is to help with best practices and ideas to lure back those who have fallen away from the faith (you may recall Pope St. John Paul II exhorted us to do this some years ago under the general heading "new evangelization") and bring more young faces into the community of the parish. A lot of this will occur at the deanery level so that resources can be best utilized in the vears ahead. However, because it is always a good idea to be looking in the same direction as our Shepherd, it seems a good idea to begin serious attempts to make our way to the cutting edge of the process rather than sit around and discover ourselves being dragged along at the end of the line.

Some years ago, when I was the pastor of two small parishes in Lima, the pastors of all the city parishes got together to take a look at this same area of concern. We hired a firm which undertook surveys, setup listening groups of both Catholics and non-Catholics, and tallied exit interviews in addition to other techniques (at the cost of \$80,000 for each of my parishes) to answer the question: "Can we bring people back?" The answer was a resounding "yes" but with the caveat that it wasn't the pastors who were going to make it happen but the people in the pews. How were they to do it? Simple: invite. How do we begin to invite the fallen away to come home? The best way is to do just that: invite. That doesn't mean cajoling or laying on guilt but genuinely finding reasons (good ones, please) to gently and compassionately ask those we already know to come along to experience the Church. I'm always amazed at the number of people who haven't been inside the church since the era of II Vatican Council and have no idea that we actually celebrate in a language they can understand. Part of asking is to listen. Many people fell away for a reason: their parish closed, the priest said something they didn't like, the abuse scandal turned them off, father always talks money or something else; others fell away, let's be honest, by being lazy or uncaring. Many left the Church because they cannot come to grips with the underlying reality of the real presence of Jesus Christ in the Sacraments. Listening gives us the opening we need to gently respond to the reason anyone might have left and replace it with a good reason to come back.

There are other ways to bring in new faces. Over the months to come, the parish staff will be attempting to put some of these in place. A few strategies may be uncomfortable because they will demand change, but as the only constant in the universe is change, we ought to get on the pendulum as it swings past or risk being toppled over when it hits us. Stay tuned for more on *Intentional Planning*.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.


Please pray for the men and women in military service.

Preventing Tick Bites: Before You Go Outdoors

Use Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)-registered insect repellent containing DEET, picaridin, IR3535, Oil of Lemon Eucalyptus (OLE), para-menthane-diol (PMD), or 2 -undecanone. Always follow product instructions. Do not use products containing OLE or PMD on children under 3 years old.

- Avoid contact with ticks
- Avoid wooded and brushy areas with high grass and leaf litter.

Walk in the center of trails.

The sacraments are the seven outward and visible signs, instituted by Christ, to confer God's inward and invisible grace. The sacraments of healing are:



RECONCILIATION:

Penance or confession is the sacrament in which sins are committed after baptism are confessed after an examination of conscience and

forgiven by a priest in the name of Christ.

*Verbal confession of sins

*Words: "I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Amen

ANOINTING OF THE SICK:

In this sacrament those who are ill are anointed to impart spiritual strength and physical healing.



*Anointing with oil.

*Words: "Through this holy anointing may the Lord in his love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit. May the Lord, who frees you from sin save you and raise you up."
