Volunteer Spotlight - Rosalie Mills


She may come in a small package, but this little lady is a strong woman with a big heart. Rosalie Mills has been working behind the scenes at Central Catholic High School for the last 16 years, with the very important job of helping the Priest Leader to prepare the altar and sacristy for Mass. She also helps students get ready to act as altar servers, cleans everything up after Mass, and keeps the CCHS chapel clean and organized.

Rosalie began working for Central Catholic when Fr. Michael Geiger was the Priest Leader. He was also the pastor at St. Patrick's Historic Parish, where Rosalie has been working for 34 years. When Fr. Geiger saw how well Rosalie took care of the parish by cleaning and setting up for Masses there, he asked her to work in the same capacity at Central Catholic. She has since worked under Fr. Geiger, Fr. Dennis Hartigan, Fr. Matthew Rader, and now Fr. David Kidd.

At CCHS, Rosalie has become a familiar face for the students, who enjoy stopping to chat with her. She is a stabilizing influence for servers as she helps them put on their vestments for Mass, and she helps them get into the proper, reverent mindset.

"It's extremely important to have someone you can rely on to do this for us," said Fr. Kidd. "We would be in a world of hurt if Rosalie wasn't on all the preparation for Mass like bees on honey!

"Rosalie sets up all the items in the sacristy that we need for Mass and Eucharistic Adoration for our students

to take down to the Sullivan Center for every Worship Wednesday. She takes care of all the altar linens, corporals, purificators, cleaning of the chapel, and decorating of the Christ the King chapel for the different seasons and feast days in the Church year. She ensures the chalice and other liturgical items are ready for me at daily Masses in the Christ the King Chapel and on retreat days. She also runs errands to Reger's Church Supplies here in Toledo to make sure we have enough hosts and altar wine. She does not miss a beat!"

Throughout her life, Rosalie has worked in several different religious settings, including Holy Spirit Seminary, Lourdes University, and Rosary Cathedral Parish. She has done everything from stripping floors and housecleaning for sisters, to doing laundry for priests.

"I like to work in religious places,"
Rosalie explained. "I'm by myself all
day long, but I'm not alone. I have God
and the saints, and I can light candles
anytime for anyone who needs prayers."
She enjoys working at Central Catholic

particularly because it gives her a chance to see and talk to the students, and she said she couldn't ask for a better boss in Fr. Kidd, whom she calls "so respectful."

Rosalie also worked at the University of Toledo for 15 years starting in the 1990s. She cleaned offices, including that of Central Catholic's current Vice President for Institutional Advancement, Eric Stockard. Eric was working at UT at the time as the assistant director for teacher placement. "Rosalie has always been sweet and supportive," he said.

Rosalie comes from a family of 12 children who grew up near Central Catholic, and she attended Woodward High School. She has five children, including sons **David Szczublewski '78** and **Kenny Szczublewski '79** who are Central Catholic alumni. She also has four grandchildren.

At the age of 82, Rosalie says she isn't planning to retire. She enjoys what she does at St. Pat's and Central Catholic, and she uses some of her spare time to deliver meals and medication to friends who can't drive. "If it weren't for God I wouldn't be here, so I want to do whatever I can for him," she explained. She has worked hard all her life and has even fought - and beat - both breast cancer and malignant melanoma. She has asked God to give her a sign if she's supposed to quit working, but so far she hasn't received one!

"Rosalie brings so much joy to staffulty members and students," Fr. Kidd added. "She is constantly leaving notes and cards, and imparting words of encouragement to people. We are so blessed to have her at Central Catholic! She is central to our faith. I am also reminded of the love of Jesus every time I get to visit with Rosalie Mills!"




SAINT IGNATIUS OF LOYOLA: SOLDIER FOR CHRIST
