

Dear People of God,

Somebody the other day suggested that we ought to begin a Bingo program to augment parish income. That person was not happy when I said "No!" I'm sure that there are still a few parishes that operate bingo programs but, to be honest, the rampant abuses which occur have led many pastors to end such programs. Far too many volunteers dip into the profits and where a parish has no place to hold bingo, the venues which are available to them take far too great a piece of the profits. My question is why do we need bingo or anything like it? Aren't we supposed to be responsible as members of the parish for its proper function, both in terms of maintaining its physical structures and its spiritual works? As parishioners all of us are called upon to be the stewards of the place and its programs, providing for the upkeep, development and ministry. The real problem has for many years been the lax attention to this responsibility by a large part of the parish.

Approximately 20% of the parish households provide 100% of the funds with which the parish does what it can do. Imagine if that other 80% of households participated in the same regular giving as the 20%. Our weekly income would rise multiple times what it is today, providing a wonderful surplus to undertake needed repairs and bring about new ministries to meet the needs of parishioners and those we serve in the community. Many of us use the excuse that we're on a fixed income, but when I sign off on the annual report, I can see that many of the people who make up that 20% of supporters are on fixed incomes! Jesus himself commented on this, saying that the widow who gave only a tiny amount was really doing far more for God's work than the rich guy who dumped in what was for him only spare change. I would invite those who are currently enjoying the benefits provided by the 20% to become part of that generous and amazingly caring group who see the parish as a serious responsibility with their giving reflective of both of love and mercy. While our future certainly depends on having people in the pew, it also depends, and perhaps to a greater extent, on the people in the pew doing their part to make sure that pew will be there next week. Whether it's the widow's mite or any other sacrificial gift, your financial support of the parish is needed and appreciated and becomes a blessing for all who are part of the community. Please, if you're part of the 80% to whom today's letter is primarily addressed, prayerfully consider doing your part.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
