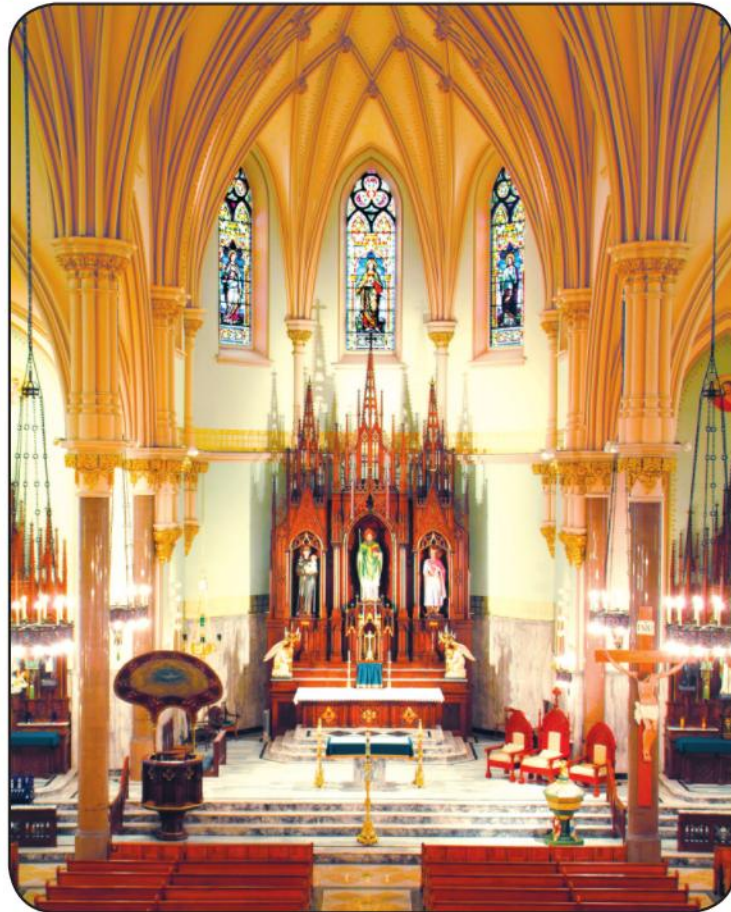

Dear People of God,

The furor over the Bishops' announcement of a document on the reception of Communion has continued to garner a lot of attention. A few weeks ago we printed Fr. Tony Recker's excellent letter addressing the widespread concerns. Nevertheless, the controversy reached my desk via a question asking why we don't just tell certain people they cannot receive the Eucharist because they're in a state of sin. Well, how do we know they're in a state of sin since sin is an interior matter of the conscience and not generally revealed by the sinner to the general public? In fact, none of us has the necessary insight or facts with which to accuse anyone directly of sin. That's between the person and God.

Indeed, the Law of the Church (canons 1321-1325 of the code of Canon Law) makes it quite clear that all of us are to take seriously God's word that he desires not the condemnation of the sinner but his conversion. The canons list reason after reason why the Church cannot condemn people for what others may perceive as sinful behaviors. Also, remember the following qualifications for a grave sin meriting any kind of grave punishment: (1) it must be grave matter in and of itself, (2) the gravity must be known and (3) the act must be done with the intention to sin.

Moral law, the knowledge of what is good and what is wrong, is just part of being a human being so it's not that difficult (1) to know what's really wrong, so wrong it's spiritually deadly. We can presume with some chance of being right (2) that knowing how wrong an action is is easy to determine. That third element, however, is much more difficult to see from the outside: (3) intention. The *why* behind a perceived moral wrong is often not known, sometimes even to the one doing the wrong thing. Thus the church leaders addressing an issue as serious as the reception of Communion must respect both the role of conscience in the behavior of the supposed sinner and must always acknowledge the intimate and personal relationship between each individual and God.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

New Materials for Historic St Patrick's Library



Have you ever visited the Solanus Casey Center in Detroit? Blessed Solanus Casey was a humble Capuchin porter who answered the door at St Bonaventure Monastery on Mt Elliott Street. He had faithfully served the people of Huntington, IN, New York City, Yonkers, NY, and Detroit, MI, by providing soup for the hungry, kind words for the troubled, and a healing touch for the ill. Wherever he served, people would line up for blocks for a moment with Bl. Solanus. Fr Solanus died in 1957. In 2012, a woman with a lifelong genetic skin disease began to heal within minutes of praying at his tomb. Pope Francis declared it a miracle, and in 2017, 70,000 people filled the football stadium in Detroit to help celebrate Solanus' beatification Mass. His cause for canonization is currently under way.
