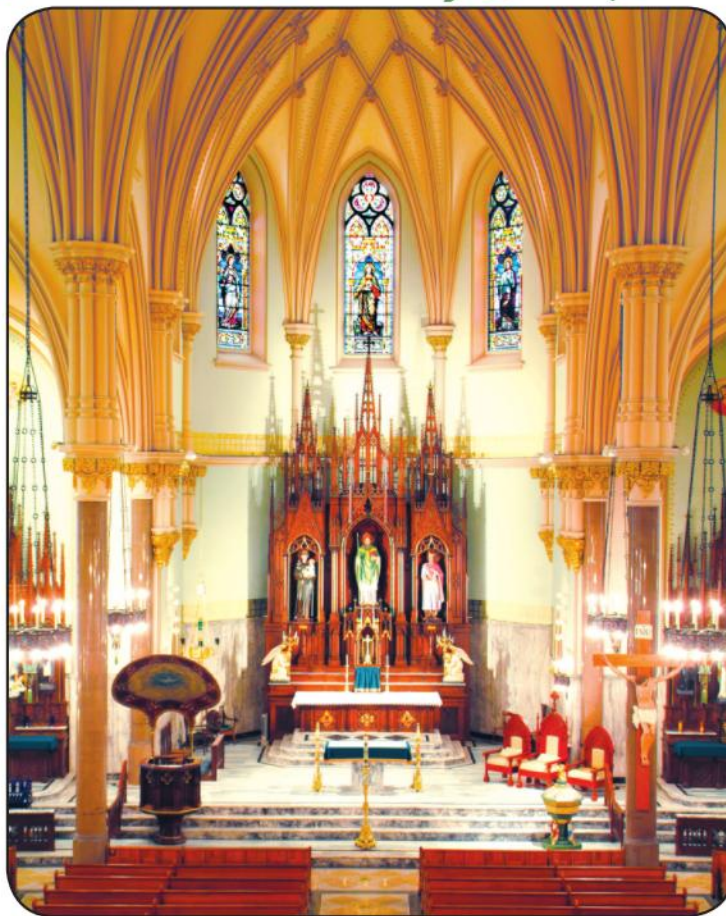

Dear People of God,

The other day I received an e-mail following mention of the “Precepts of the Catholic Church” during a streamed Mass. The writer wondered what these *precepts* were as they were unfamiliar territory. For many Catholics, they may well have been forgotten or even be relatively unknown; however, they are very real and we all ought to give them periodic attention as a check-list on how well we’re living the Catholic life.

A *precept* may be thought of as a rule or law, but it is also described, perhaps better, as a principle or defining behavior. In this sense, most athletic teams have precepts, including what colors we’ll wear to the game, which fight song we’ll be singing, what mascot we expect to see on the sidelines and often many more than those. Ohio State fans know that someone wearing maize and gold isn’t an Ohio State fan!

The Church has certain expectations from its own professed members, minimal behaviors which others ought to see and which mark a person as part of the community. Here they are:

1. Attendance at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation
2. Confession of serious sin at least once a year
3. Reception of Holy Communion at least once a year during the Easter season
4. Observance of the days of fast and abstinence providing for the needs of the Church

These are the least we can do to consider ourselves as a Catholic; the operative word here is *least*. None of us should ever be content to do the least we can. In fact, the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* urges all Catholics to live so vibrantly as members of the community that each person uses his or her gifts on a regular basis beyond the minimum for the good of the world in which we live and the building up of the Kingdom toward which we make our pilgrim way.

As part of our spiritual growth, each of us should make a periodic assessment of the behaviors by which we conduct our lives. Do they truly allow us to claim to be Catholic? Do they reveal to others around us that we are Catholic? Are we happy to be doing the least or do we challenge ourselves to take each of those behavioral marks and genuinely incorporate them into our daily lifestyle?

You can read more about the precepts in the *Catechism* or go to the FORMED platform and look them up. You’ll find some good video and audio presentations that dive more deeply into Catholic behaviors.

### **The Celebration of Sacraments**

**Infant Baptism:** The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults:** RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

**Penance:** The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony:** Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick:** When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

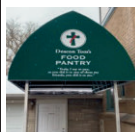

### New Materials for Historic St Patrick's Library



Have you ever visited the Solanus Casey Center in Detroit? Blessed Solanus Casey was a humble Capuchin porter who answered the door at St Bonaventure Monastery on Mt Elliott Street. He had faithfully served the people of Huntington, IN, New York City, Yonkers, NY, and Detroit, MI, by providing soup for the hungry, kind words for the troubled, and a healing touch for the ill. Wherever he served, people would line up for blocks for a moment with Bl. Solanus. Fr Solanus died in 1957. In 2012, a woman with a lifelong genetic skin disease began to heal within minutes of praying at his tomb. Pope Francis declared it a miracle, and in 2017, 70,000 people filled the football stadium in Detroit to help celebrate Solanus' beatification Mass. His cause for canonization is currently under way.
