

Dear People of God,

It's always interesting to listen in as people leave church after Mass. You hear a lack of knowledge about a lot of what happens at Mass. For example, the other day I heard someone on the way out mumbling about "all that Protestant music they sing!" (Disappointing that the person didn't say "all that Protestant music we sing" since everybody at Mass is encouraged to join in the singing.) I'm not sure whether the piece, which I recognized as one of my favorites, is "Protestant" or not, but if you take a quick look at the composers and lyricists of the hymns in the general hymnal/Missalette, vou'll discover about half, if not more, of the most commonly sung hymns used at the parish are from the Protestant camp, including the one which that person seemed opposed to being used.

Here are a few examples you ought to know fairly well because we use them regularly: Amazing Grace; The Old Hundreth ("Praise God from Whom All Blessings Flow;" the music is also used for numerous other hymns); What Wondrous Love Is This; Holy, Holy, Holy; Lord of All Hopefulness; Nearer My God to Thee (if you attend my funeral, you'll hopefully be singing this one in my memory of course, with an All-Ohio World Series in my bucket list, it'll be a while); I Heard the Voice of Jesus Say; Hark! The Herald Angels Sing; Christ the Lord is Ris'n Today; People Look East; Alleluia, Alleluia, Hearts and Voices Heav'nward Raise (the tune is common to many other hymns by both Catholic and non-Catholic lyricists); Alleluia, Sing to Jesus; Lord of the Dance; God Rest Ye Merry Gentlemen; Faith of Our Fathers; To Jesus Christ, Our Sovereign King: O God, Our Help in Ages Past:

The King of Love My Shepherd Is; Lift High the Cross (which was the recessional at my ordination); For All the Saints; O Little Town of Bethlehem; Love Divine, All Loves Excelling; All Creatures of Our God and King (the easily recognized music is from a non-Catholic composer); Blessed Assurance; On Jordan's Bank: Joy to the World: O God, Beyond All Praising (the tune is from Holst's Planets and a favorite of the liturgists at Episcopal celebrations); How Great Thou Art; I Sing the Mighty Pow'r of God; How Can I Keep from Singing; Now Thank We All Our God; Come, Ye Thankful People, Come' Let All Things Now Living; For the Beauty of the Earth; Battle Hymn of the Republic; Christ Be Beside Me (St. Patrick's Breastplate by a non-Catholic???); The Church's One Foundation and there are many more; lest we forget, here's a very well-known final favorite: Holy God, We Praise Thy Name. You can pretty much recognize Catholic hymns: they all have a refrain.

I'm not sure why many of us believe that all the golden oldies are from a Catholic hymnal; until fairly recently hymns were in Latin so when we got permission to sing in our native tongue, we went to the already popular non-Catholic hymnody and began using it widely in the Catholic liturgy. That's nothing new for Christianity in general: we've borrowed the best of the best since the time of Jesus and will no doubt continue to do so since we're a truly universal (catholic) Church. So, *Let Us Raise Our Voices and Sing*!

### The Celebration of Sacraments

**Infant Baptism**: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>**: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

**Penance**: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony**: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick**: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.





## Salvation History #7 Jesus' Suffering, Death and Resurrection

At the Passover, Jesus ate the traditional seder with his disciples—he took the bread, blessed it and broke it, saying, "Take and eat: this is my body." He then took the cup, gave thanks and shared it, saying, "Drink from it all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed on behalf of many for the forgiveness of sins." This is the foundation of the Catholic sacrament of the Eucharist or Holy Communion.

The local leaders were threatened by Jesus and his ministry, and had him arrested, tortured and crucified. Three days after he died, his tomb was found empty. He had risen from the dead.

Christ's resurrection fulfills the Old Testament promises and shows that he is the Son of God and God himself. Christ's death liberates us from sin, and his resurrection opens up new life for us in heaven. For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." John 3:16.
