

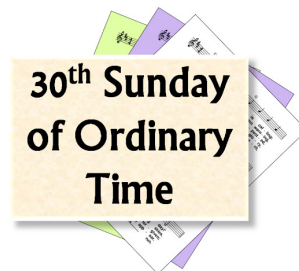
Dear People of God,

Last week after I mentioned that the Catholic Church has borrowed a lot of non-Catholic "stuff," somebody who read my letter during the homily asked what on earth I was talking about, possibly thinking that the Church is pristine and purely Catholic. Well, maybe not as I have always recognized: the Eucharist is itself an example. It's taken from the Passover Supper celebrated by the Jews since the time of the Exodus. We use the Old Testament which was the written sacred word of the Jews. We use blessed medals adopted from the amulets of the Roman pagan religion, especially where John organized the Church at Ephesus. We put up Christmas trees which we borrowed from the Germanic peoples. In fact, most of the Christmas decorations we use without a thought are borrowed from some pagan rite. The architecture of many of our churches is either Greek pagan or Roman pagan in its origins: in fact, many still-used Catholic churches were originally dedicated to pagan idols, including the parish church Francis of Assisi attended as a youth. The vestments of the priest are borrowed from the pagan religions of the first century. We might think Gregorian Chant is uniquely "Catholic" but we'd be wrong: it's just the Church's version of the contemporary music of the time.

What is uniquely "Catholic" is rare and difficult to pin down beyond the simple rituals which surround the seven sacraments. Because they are so simple, people wanted to make them seem grander and more elegant and turned to what they experienced elsewhere, bringing rituals into the church to become part of the ceremonials we think are original. Does that take away from the dignity of the real "Catholic" essentials? Not at all. Ceremony is a significant aspect of human life; when we make something more elegant, more dignified without losing the essence of what it is, we're celebrating; we're creating a familiar routine or ritual which brings about understanding and comfort. I might mention that music is perhaps the most uncommon thing about our Church. Over the centuries we have turned to the secular world for our music and even today, Catholic composers will emulate what's happening in the world around us so that when we sing or hear music, it will sound familiar and comforting even if it's "new."

Should this bother us? No. The Church adapts to the signs of the times and much of that adaptation sticks even beyond the times to become the "tried and true" which defines us as Christians and as Catholics.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

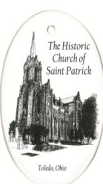
