

Dear People of God,

The news is filled with the ongoing discussion (or yelling back and forth) about abortion, with one side claiming that there is a right to the use of one's body which justifies abortion on demand. I've commented often enough on *rights* versus *privileges* (the Supreme Court found in the Constitution a *privilege* for some people to seek an abortion but there is no right since not everyone has the privilege identified by the Court).

God gave us a brain and we're supposed to use it to determine which actions are appropriate and which are not. We come equipped by the Creator with the unique capacity to know right from wrong: our brains should key us in on which behaviors are good and therefore should be the behaviors we choose to exhibit. As the Founders correctly stated, all humans have a right to life. They did not recognize a correlative right to take life.

Certainly, all of us have a right to the use of our body but that comes with a host of obligations and responsibilities because we are in a community, a group of others who have similar rights and the same responsibilities. The primary obligation with regard to the use of our body is to preserve life, our own and that of all the others with whom we share the community. Proper exercise of the right has to be put in play at the correct time and that's where the Court stepped in to find a privilege because some people fail to properly use the right and fail altogether to respect the obligations.

Any biologist and any good moral theologian will tell us that one of the primary purposes of our sexual capacity is to generate the next generation lest we do away with the human race by attrition (many so-called first world nations are doing just that). Any time we exercise the right to express our sexual self, we have the obligation to accept the consequences. The primary consequence of sexual behaviors is pregnancy. We have a moral obligation to see a pregnancy through to its biological conclusion: that's the right and the responsibility.

However, living in a very self-centered culture in which the individual claims superiority over the whole, the responsibility is often disregarded and a very real human person's right to life is set aside in favor of the privilege extended to a particular group of people. The right to the body ends, or is at least curtailed, when the life of another is brought into the equation (the time to consider whether we want children or not comes before the pregnancy, not as a result of it). Unfortunately, there are always those who have no respect for genuine rights and loudly claim a privilege to do as they please, almost always for selfish reasons. Keep them in prayer for their timely conversion.

#### The Celebration of Sacraments

<u>Infant Baptism</u>: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults**: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

**Penance**: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

<u>Matrimony</u>: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

#### The HSP Soup Kitchen






