

Dear People of God,

It's not often that Christmas occurs just before a bulletin day but that creates a week-end for us to rejoice and be glad. The birth of Jesus Christ provides us with the opportunity to celebrate and share with others the joy of salvation now among us. Too often the reality of Christmas day's meaning is lost in the glitz and alamour of the secular world's celebration of aiftgiving, dinner parties, ski vacations, romantic movies and those far more real proposals of marriage (congratulations to all the couples whose celebrations included taking the plunge). All these are great and we need to celebrate them. However, we should never forget that Christmas is a contraction of Christ's Mass: Eucharistic thanksgiving for the birth of our savior. It should be high on our priorities list to be in attendance at the solemn celebration of the Lord's Supper, to hear the Word proclaimed and relish the salvation offered us by the innocent child lying in a manger.

The gifts of the magi (wise ones, not kings), portend the means of the salvation earned for us by Jesus' suffering and death, so part of our celebration should anticipate the seasons that lie ahead: Lent and Easter. That makes the Mass all the more meaningful because it accomplishes just that. Lent is compacted into the Penitential Rite in which we express our participation in sin and the sorrow and remorse that impel us to be present to the God of love. The Eucharist replicates all of Holy Week, beginning with the ceremonial supper shared by the faithful on Holy Thursday, the agony endured by our compassionate God on Good Friday and the Resurrection which restores us to the fullness of our humanity and provides us the divine connection to Jesus himself. Perhaps the best part about being present to the community of faith on this additional marvelous semi -festival day is that regardless of how large or small the gifts we offer in the collection plate, the gift we receive in turn, the very living body and blood of the savior God, makes all else pale in comparison. Whether you're ten and got that bike you wanted (or more likely the newest version of X-Box), fourteen and got the newest cell phone with all the extras, or forty-five and got that condo you always wanted in Aspen, or eighty and got a tie from your favorite niece, think for a moment of the gifts God gives, the gifts of love and life.

Thanks for joining the praying community here at the Historic Church of St. Patrick, Toledo's Irish Destination Parish. We proudly celebrate our Irish roots, even those of us who had to have our other ethnicities transplanted into the rich soil of Ireland here at St. Pat's. Plan on coming back again, often. We'll make room any time, especially on the Sunday near St. Patrick's Day when we hold our annual St. Patrick's Day Mass and Open House. *Feicfidh mé ann thú*

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.



If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion. When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan,

parish, or school events in that geographic region are also cancelled.

Healthy Eating Tips for the Holidays for Diabetics: Get Your Zzz's. Going out more and staying out later often means cutting back on sleep. Sleep loss can make it harder to manage your blood sugar, and when you're sleep deprived you'll tend to eat more and prefer high-fat, high-sugar food. Aim for 7 to 8 hours per night to guard against mindless eating. Most of all, remember what the season is about - celebrating and connecting with the people you care about. When you focus more on the fun, it's easier to focus less on the food.
